2	relating to the creation of a mental health jail diversion pilot		
3	program in Bexar County.		
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:		
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 7, Health and Safety Code, is		
6	amended by adding Chapter 581 to read as follows:		
7	CHAPTER 581. MENTAL HEALTH JAIL DIVERSION PILOT PROGRAM; BEXAR		
8	COUNTY		
9	Sec. 581.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "commission"		
10	means the Health and Human Services Commission.		
11	Sec. 581.002. MENTAL HEALTH JAIL DIVERSION PILOT PROGRAM.		
12	The commission, in cooperation with the local mental health		
13	authority that serves Bexar County, shall establish a pilot program		
14	in Bexar County for the purpose of reducing recidivism and the		
15	frequency of arrests and incarceration among persons with mental		
16	illness in that county.		
17	Sec. 581.003. CRIMINAL JUSTICE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE MODEL.		
18	The local mental health authority that serves Bexar County shall		
19	design and test through the pilot program a criminal justice mental		
20	health service model oriented toward facilitating treatment for		
21	persons with mental illness and substance use disorders to reduce		
22	recidivism and frequency of arrests and incarceration of persons		
23	with mental illness in Bexar County. The model must include		
24	evidence-based practices, including:		

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1	(1) psychiatric services;			
2	(2) substance use disorder treatments;			
3	(3) treatment for co-occurring mental health and			
4	substance use disorders;			
5	(4) integrated primary care, mental health, and			
6	chemical dependency services;			
7	(5) motivational interviews to decrease recidivism;			
8	(6) methods to maintain sobriety;			
9	(7) medical detoxification services;			
10	(8) intensive case management to address social			
11	determinants of health;			
12	(9) local mental health authority hospital liaison			
13	transitional services, including case management;			
14	(10) medication-assisted treatment; and			
15	(11) treatment of medical issues, including through			
16	inpatient hospitalization if necessary.			
17	Sec. 581.004. LOCAL SERVICES COORDINATION. In designing			
18	the criminal justice mental health service model described by			
19	Section 581.003, the local mental health authority that serves			
20	Bexar County shall coordinate with University of the Incarnate Word			
21	and Southwest General Hospital. In providing services under the			
22	pilot program, the local mental health authority shall use			
23	personnel enrolled in established post-graduate residency training			
24	programs through the Texas Institute of Graduate Medical Education			
25	and Research.			
26	Sec. 581.005. PROGRAM CAPACITY. (a) In implementing the			
27	pilot program, the commission shall ensure the program has the			

1 resources to provide mental health and substance use disorder 2 treatment for incarceration diversion services for not fewer than 3 10 inpatient beds and for stays of a period of 60 to 90 days. 4 (b) Before the commission implements the pilot program, the 5 commission and the local mental health authority that serves Bexar County jointly shall establish clear criteria for identifying a 6 7 target population to be served by the program. The criteria must 8 prioritize serving a target population composed of members at high risk of recidivism and with severe mental illness, substance use 9 10 disorders, or co-occurring mental illness and substance use disorders. 11 Sec. 581.006. FINANCING THE PROGRAM. (a) In consultation 12 with the local mental health authority that serves Bexar County and 13 Southwest General Hospital, the commission shall pay a case rate at 14 15 the rate at which services are funded for the pilot program. The creation of the pilot program under this chapter is contingent on 16 17 funding from the commission for persons with mental illness or substance use disorders provided by the state for the program. 18 19 (b) It is the intent of the legislature that appropriations made to fund the pilot program are made in addition to and will not 20

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20 made to fund the prior program are made in addition to and will not
21 reduce the amount of appropriations otherwise made to the local
22 mental health authority that serves Bexar County.

23 (c) The local mental health authority that serves Bexar
24 County may seek and receive gifts and grants from federal sources,
25 foundations, individuals, and other sources for the benefit of the
26 pilot program.

27 <u>Sec. 581.007.</u> INSPECTIONS. The commission may make

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1 inspections of the operation of, and provision of mental health and substance use treatment for incarceration diversion services 2 3 through, the pilot program on behalf of the state to ensure state 4 funds are used effectively. 5 Sec. 581.008. REPORT. (a) Not later than December 1, 2022, the executive commissioner shall evaluate and submit a report 6 7 concerning the effectiveness of the pilot program in reducing recidivism and the frequency of arrests and incarceration of 8 persons with mental illness and substance use disorders in Bexar 9 County to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the 10 house of representatives, and the presiding officers of the 11 12 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over health and human services issues 13 14 and over criminal justice issues. 15 (b) The report must include a description of the features of the criminal justice mental health service model designed and 16 17 tested under the pilot program and the executive commissioner's recommendation whether to expand use of the model statewide. 18 19 (c) In conducting the evaluation required under Subsection (a), the executive commissioner shall compare the rate of 20 recidivism in Bexar County among persons in the target population 21 22 before the date the pilot program is implemented in the community to 23 the rate of recidivism among those persons one year after the date 24 the program is implemented in the community. The executive commissioner may include in the evaluation measures of the 25 26 effectiveness of the program related to the well-being of persons 27 served under the program.
