## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the creation of a task force to study access to
- 3 telephone and Internet service among homeless veterans.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "task force" means the
- 6 task force established under Section 2 of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF TASK FORCE. (a) The Texas
- 8 Veterans Commission, in collaboration with the Public Utility
- 9 Commission of Texas, shall establish a task force to:
- 10 (1) evaluate the ability of homeless veterans to
- 11 access telephone and Internet service;
- 12 (2) determine the effect that increasing a homeless
- 13 veteran's access to telephone and Internet service would have on
- 14 the homeless veteran's ability to obtain available services and
- 15 benefits;
- 16 (3) consider the potential for partnerships between
- 17 public and private entities to provide access to telephone and
- 18 Internet service to homeless veterans at a low or reduced cost; and
- 19 (4) assess federal, state, and private funding sources
- 20 available to increase access to telephone and Internet service by
- 21 homeless veterans.
- 22 (b) The task force may seek assistance from any organization
- 23 that serves veterans, including homeless veterans.
- 24 SECTION 3. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. The task force is

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- 1 composed of four members as follows:
- 2 (1) one representative of the Texas Veterans
- 3 Commission;
- 4 (2) one representative of the Public Utility
- 5 Commission of Texas; and
- 6 (3) two members appointed by the governor, including:
- 7 (A) one member representing telephone service
- 8 providers; and
- 9 (B) one member representing Internet service
- 10 providers.
- 11 SECTION 4. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. (a) The executive
- 12 director of each state agency represented on the task force shall
- 13 appoint an employee of the agency to serve as the agency's
- 14 representative on the task force not later than November 1, 2023.
- 15 (b) Not later than November 1, 2023, the governor shall
- 16 appoint two members to the task force as provided by Section 3 of
- 17 this Act.
- 18 SECTION 5. REPORT. Not later than November 1, 2024, the
- 19 task force shall prepare and submit to the Texas Veterans
- 20 Commission, the Public Utility Commission of Texas, the governor,
- 21 the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives, and the members of the legislature a written
- 23 report on its findings.
- 24 SECTION 6. ABOLISHMENT AND EXPIRATION. The task force is
- 25 abolished and this Act expires January 1, 2025.
- 26 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 27 1, 2023.
