4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 201.615, Transportation Code, is amended
6	by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
7	follows:
8	(a) The department shall consider, in accordance with the
9	NEPA requirements for studying design alternatives, the following
10	factors when developing transportation projects that involve the
11	construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or resurfacing of a
12	highway, other than a maintenance resurfacing project:
13	(1) the extent to which the project promotes safety;
14	(2) the durability of the project;
15	(3) the economy of maintenance of the project;
16	(4) the impact of the project on:
17	(A) the natural and artificial environment;
18	(B) the scenic and aesthetic character of the
19	area in which the project is located;
20	(C) preservation efforts; and
21	(D) each affected local community and its
22	economy;
23	(5) the access for other modes of transportation,
24	including those that promote physically active communities; [and]

- 1 (6) except as provided by Subsection (c), the
- 2 aesthetic character of the project, including input from each
- 3 affected local community;
- 4 (7) except as provided by Subsection (d), an
- 5 alternative design for the project that has been approved by a vote
- 6 of the governing body of a municipality or county that represents an
- 7 <u>affected local community; and</u>
- 8 (8) the negative impacts to an affected local
- 9 community from previous transportation projects.
- 10 (d) Subsection (a)(7) does not apply to a transportation
- 11 project if the department finds that an alternative design for a
- 12 transportation project approved by the governing body of a
- 13 municipality or county is frivolous, unreasonable, or intended to
- 14 delay a transportation project.
- 15 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
