- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.053(a), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) The commissioner shall adopt a set of indicators of the
- 8 quality of learning and achievement, including the indicators under
- 9 Subsection (c). The commissioner periodically shall review the
- 10 indicators for the consideration of appropriate revisions and
- 11 ensure a cut score necessary for a district to receive an "A".
- 12 (a-1) The indicators adopted by the commissioner under
- 13 Subsection (a) must measure and evaluate school districts and
- 14 campuses with respect to:

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- 15 (1) improving student preparedness for success in:
- 16 (A) subsequent grade levels; and
- 17 (B) entering the workforce, the military, or
- 18 postsecondary education;
- 19 (2) reducing, with the goal of eliminating, student
- 20 academic achievement differentials among students from different
- 21 racial and ethnic groups and socioeconomic backgrounds; and
- 22 (3) informing parents and the community regarding
- 23 campus and district performance.
- (b) Performance on the achievement indicators adopted under

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- 1 Subsection (c) shall be compared to state-established standards.
- 2 The indicators must be based on information that is disaggregated
- 3 by race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status.
- 4 (c) School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on
- 5 three domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this
- 6 section that include:
- 7 (1) in the student achievement domain, indicators of
- 8 student achievement that must include:
- 9 (A) for evaluating the performance of districts
- 10 and campuses generally:
- 11 (i) an indicator that accounts for the
- 12 results of assessment instruments required under Sections
- 13 39.023(a), (c), and (l), as applicable for the district and campus,
- 14 including the results of assessment instruments required for
- 15 graduation retaken by a student, aggregated across grade levels by
- 16 subject area, including:
- 17 (a) for the performance standard
- 18 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the
- 19 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the
- 20 assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject
- 21 area; and
- (b) for the college readiness
- 23 performance standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the
- 24 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the
- 25 assessment instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject
- 26 area; and
- 27 (ii) an indicator that accounts for the

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- 1 results of assessment instruments required under Section
- 2 39.023(b), as applicable for the district and campus, including the
- 3 percentage of students who performed satisfactorily on the
- 4 assessment instruments, as determined by the performance standard
- 5 adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by subject
- 6 area; and
- 7 (B) for evaluating the performance of high school
- 8 campuses and districts that include high school campuses,
- 9 indicators that account for:
- 10 (i) students who satisfy the Texas Success
- 11 Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the
- 12 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334 on
- 13 an assessment instrument in reading or mathematics designated by
- 14 the coordinating board under that section;
- 15 (ii) students who satisfy relevant
- 16 performance standards on advanced placement tests or similar
- 17 assessments;
- 18 (iii) students who earn dual course credits
- 19 in the dual credit courses;
- 20 (iv) students who enlist in the armed
- 21 forces of the United States or the Texas National Guard;
- (v) students who earn industry
- 23 certifications;
- 24 (vi) students admitted into postsecondary
- 25 industry certification programs that require as a prerequisite for
- 26 entrance successful performance at the secondary level;
- 27 (vii) students whose successful completion

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- 1 of a course or courses under Section 28.014 indicates the student's
- 2 preparation to enroll and succeed, without remediation, in an
- 3 entry-level general education course for a baccalaureate degree or
- 4 associate degree;
- 5 (viii) students who successfully met
- 6 standards on a composite of indicators that through research
- 7 indicates the student's preparation to enroll and succeed, without
- 8 remediation, in an entry-level general education course for a
- 9 baccalaureate degree or associate degree;
- 10 (ix) high school graduation rates, computed
- 11 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted in compliance
- 12 with the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.)
- 13 subject to the exclusions provided by Subsections (g), (g-1),
- 14 (g-2), (g-3), and (g-4);
- 15 (x) students who successfully completed an
- 16 OnRamps dual enrollment course;
- 17 (xi) students who successfully completed a
- 18 practicum or internship approved by the State Board of Education;
- 19 (xii) students who are awarded an associate
- 20 degree; and
- 21 (xiii) students who successfully completed
- 22 a program of study in career and technical education;
- 23 (2) in the school progress domain, indicators for
- 24 effectiveness in promoting student learning, which must include:
- 25 (A) for assessment instruments, including
- 26 assessment instruments under Subdivisions (1)(A)(i) and (ii), the
- 27 percentage of students who met the standard for improvement, as

- 1 determined by the commissioner; and
- 2 (B) for evaluating relative performance, the
- 3 performance of districts and campuses compared to similar districts
- 4 or campuses; and
- 5 (3) in the closing the gaps domain, the use of
- 6 disaggregated data to demonstrate the differentials among students
- 7 from different racial and ethnic groups, socioeconomic
- 8 backgrounds, and other factors, including:
- 9 (A) students formerly receiving special
- 10 education services;
- 11 (B) students continuously enrolled; and
- 12 (C) students who are mobile.
- 13 (c-1) An indicator adopted under Subsection (c) that would
- 14 measure improvements in student achievement cannot negatively
- 15 affect the commissioner's review of a school district or campus if
- 16 that district or campus is already achieving at the highest level
- 17 for that indicator.
- 18 (c-2) The commissioner by rule shall determine a method by
- 19 which a student's performance may be included in determining the
- 20 performance rating of a school district or campus under Section
- 21 39.054 if, before the student graduates, the student:
- 22 (1) satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI)
- 23 college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher
- 24 Education Coordinating Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment
- 25 instrument designated by the coordinating board under that section;
- 26 or
- 27 (2) performs satisfactorily on an assessment

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- 1 instrument under Section 39.023(c), notwithstanding Subsection (d)
- 2 of this section.
- 3 (c-3) Any standard for improvement determined by the
- 4 commissioner as described by Subsection (c)(2)(A) must allow for
- 5 appropriately crediting a student for growth if the student
- 6 performs at the highest achievement standard in the previous and
- 7 current school year.
- 8 (d) For purposes of Subsection (c), the commissioner by rule
- 9 shall determine the period within which a student must retake an
- 10 assessment instrument for that assessment instrument to be
- 11 considered in determining the performance rating of the district
- 12 under Section 39.054.
- 13 (d-1) In aggregating results of assessment instruments
- 14 across grade levels by subject in accordance with Subsection
- 15 (c)(1)(A)(i), the performance of a student enrolled below the high
- 16 school level on an assessment instrument required under Section
- 17 39.023(c) is included with results relating to other students
- 18 enrolled at the same grade level.
- (e) For purposes of Subsection (c)(3)(A), a student
- 20 formerly receiving special education services means a student whose
- 21 enrollment information:
- (1) for the preceding school year, as reported through
- 23 the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS),
- 24 indicates the student was enrolled at the campus and was
- 25 participating in a special education program; and
- 26 (2) for the current school year, as reported through
- 27 the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) and as

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- 1 reported on assessment instruments administered to the student
- 2 under Section 39.023, indicates the student is enrolled at the
- 3 campus and is not participating in a special education program.
- 4 (f) Annually, the commissioner shall define the state
- 5 standard for the current school year for each achievement indicator
- 6 adopted under this section. In consultation with educators,
- 7 parents, and business and industry representatives, as necessary,
- 8 the commissioner shall establish and modify standards to
- 9 continuously improve student performance to achieve the goals of
- 10 eliminating achievement gaps based on race, ethnicity, and
- 11 socioeconomic status and to ensure this state is a national leader
- 12 in preparing students for postsecondary success.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 14 school year.
- 15 SECTOIN 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
