6 SECTION 1. Section 124.001(b), Government Code, is amended

8 (b) If a defendant who was arrested for or charged with,

10 <u>supervision for any misdemeanor or felony offense</u> successfully

11 completes a veterans treatment court program, after notice to, and

agreement of, the attorney representing the state and a hearing in

15 involved event, the veterans treatment court shall provide to the

7 Article 55.02, Code of Criminal Procedure.
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8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
