| 7 | CHAPTER 381. COLLECTION AND PUBLICATION OF DATA ON AFFORDABLE |

| 9 | SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS |
| 10 | Sec. 381.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to: |
| 11 | (1) empower residents in need of affordable housing |
| 12 | with a greater awareness of available affordable housing options; |
| 13 | and |
| 14 | (2) provide more standardized, transparent, and |
| 15 | easily accessible affordable housing data to municipal |
| 16 | governments, residents, and private entities; and |
| 17 | (3) promote economic development and equitable access |
| 18 | to affordable housing availability. |
| 19 | Sec. 381.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: |
| 20 | (1) "affordable housing unit" means: |
| 21 | (A) an income-restricted housing unit, such as: |
| 22 | (i) income-restricted housing, including |
| 23 | housing offered by the United States Department of Housing and |
| 24 | Urban Development; |

1 (ii) public housing; 2 (iii) housing obtained with a voucher 3 provided through the housing choice voucher program under Section 8, United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. Section 1437f); 4 5 (iv) permanent supportive housing provided by the Health and Human Services Commission; 6 7 (v) service-enriched housing provided by 8 the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs; (vi) housing provided by an affordable 9 10 housing initiative operated by a municipality; and (vii) rental units not described by 11 12 Subdivisions (i)-(vi) for which rent is not more than 30 percent of the lowest hou<u>sehold income quartile in a municipality.</u> 13 14 (2) "public information" has the meaning assigned by 15 Section 552.002, Government Code. Sec. 381.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to 16 17 municipalities with a total population of 100,000 or more. SUBCHAPTER B. COLLECTION AND PUBLICATION OF DATA 18 Sec. 381.051. REQUIREMENT OF ANNUAL SURVEY. (a) 19 The municipality shall conduct no less frequently than once per 20 calendar year a survey of all affordable housing units within its 21 22 jurisdiction and shall create a complete list of affordable housing units and maintain that data within a cloud-based data repository 23 24 that allows for real-time updates of the housing data by approved 25 users. 26 (b) For each unit in the list of affordable housing units

described in Subsection (a), the municipality will also record the

1 following characteristics, as applicable: 2 (1) the monthly rent amount organized by unit type and 3 corresponding average median income (AMI) restriction; 4 (2) cost of basic utilities not included in the 5 monthly rent amount; 6 (3) eligibility requirements for tenants, including 7 but not limited to those laid out in Section 2306.004(15)-(17), 8 Government Code; (4) the length of any waiting list; 9 10 (5) distance to essential services; 11 (6) distance to community spaces, such as public parks 12 or community centers; (7) any social services provided for tenants, 13 14 including but not limited to those included in the Permanent 15 Supportive Housing Program as defined in 42 U.S.C. Section 11381-11389 and Texas multifamily programs governed by the Uniform 16 17 Multifamily Rules and applicable provisions of the Qualified Allocation Plan administered by the Texas Department of Housing and 18 19 Community affairs under section 10.619 of the Texas Administrative C<u>ode; and</u> 20 21 (8) a phone number, mailing address, and electronic 22 mail address for the current property manager to inquire about 23 renting the unit. 24 (c) The municipality may use information collected in previous surveys conducted in accordance with Subsection (a) or 25 26 other information the municipality may have on record, provided that the municipality confirms such information is up to date. 27

1 (d) Any state agency may contact a municipality for the purpose of requesting any of the information outlined in this 2 Section regarding affordable housing units within the 3 municipality's jurisdiction and the municipality shall provide all 4 pertinent public information in the municipality's records to the 5 6 state agency. 7 Sec. 381.052. PUBLICATION OF DATA. (a) The municipality 8 shall create a publicly available Internet web application and publically available mobile application or utilize an existing 9 10 publicly accessible Internet web application and publically available mobile application to make available all public 11 12 information collected in the survey outlined in Section 381.051 13 such that: 14 (1) prospective tenants can search for individual 15 affordable housing units and sort them according to the characteristics outlined in Section 381.051(b); and 16 17 (2) the complete survey data set as referenced in Sec. 381.051(a) are available to review. 18 19 (b) The municipality shall update the Internet web application and database described in Subsection (a) as frequently 20 as new public information outlined in Section 381.051 becomes 21 available to the municipality. 22 SECTION 2. Section 371.001(a), Local Government Code, is 23 24 amended to read as follows:

(a) The governing body of a municipality with a population
of 900,000 or less may appropriate from its general fund an amount
not to exceed one percent of the general fund budget for that year

Section 371.021(a), Local Government Code, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 9 (a) The governing body of a general-law municipality may appropriate from its general fund an amount not to exceed five cents 10 per \$100 assessed valuation for the purpose of : 11 (1) advertising the municipality and promoting its 12 growth and development [+]; and 13 14 (2) promoting awareness of affordable housing options 15 within the municipality, including by promoting the Internet web application and mobile application outlined in Section 381.052, 16 17 Local Government Code. 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023
