4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 132, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 132.027 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 132.027. PERFORMANCE INDICATORS. (a) The commission
8	shall adopt a set of performance indicators for the purpose of
9	measuring and evaluating the quality of the learning and
10	achievement of students enrolled in programs operated by career
11	schools or colleges. The commission periodically shall review the
12	indicators and make appropriate revisions based on that review.
13	(b) The performance indicators adopted under Subsection (a)
14	must allow for the assessment of a career school or college program
15	with respect to:
16	(1) industry recognition of the program and the
17	corresponding value that industry attaches to the program and to
18	any certifications or licenses related to the program;
19	(2) the rate at which students are able to
20	successfully complete the program;
21	(3) the availability of a program-related
22	certification or license after a student completes the program;
23	(4) the likelihood that a certification or license
24	related to the program will:

1	(A) lead to postsecondary work, an
2	apprenticeship program, or established industry credentials; or
3	(B) support employment in multiple regions of
4	<pre>this state;</pre>
5	(5) whether a program-related certification or
6	license will be awarded by an independent third-party organization
7	using predetermined standards for knowledge, skills, and
8	competencies; and
9	(6) the inclusion of accepted best practices for the
10	program that align to best practices contained in:
11	(A) widely accepted industry standards; or
12	(B) standards established by an independent
13	third-party organization with expertise in gathering information
14	from employers related to the value attached to any certifications
15	or licenses related to the program.
16	(c) The commission shall:
17	(1) develop a methodology for determining the minimum
18	acceptable standards for a career school or college based on the
19	performance indicators adopted under Subsection (a); and
20	(2) evaluate annually 20 percent of career school and
21	college programs in all regions of this state for compliance with
22	the minimum acceptable standards described by Subdivision (1).
23	(d) A career school or college offering a program that fails
24	to meet the minimum standards developed under Subsection (c) is
25	ineligible to enter into a contract with a local workforce
26	development board with respect to that program.
27	(e) Not later than September 1 of each year, the commission

- 1 shall publish a list of each career school and college program that
- 2 has been reviewed by the commission and that meets the minimum
- 3 <u>acceptable standards developed under Subsection (c).</u>
- 4 (f) Rules adopted by the commission under Section 132.021
- 5 must include rules for the periodic review of performance
- 6 <u>indicators</u>.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than September 1, 2024, the Texas
- 8 Workforce Commission shall publish the initial list required under
- 9 Section 132.027(e), Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
