7	Sec. 47.004 1.010. AGREED DIVORCE ORDER. (a) A court with
8	jurisdiction over a case and all parties shall accept for entry any
9	proposed order, without requiring live testimony or actual
10	appearance before the court, so long as the following conditions
11	are satisfied:
12	(b) the proposed order is agreed upon by the parties;
13	(c) the proposed order includes signatures of counsel for
14	the respective parties approving the form of the order, if
15	applicable;
16	(d) the proposed order includes signatures of the respective
17	parties approving the form and substance of the order;
18	(e) the proposed order is accompanied by an affidavit or
19	unsworn declaration of at least one party setting for the necessary
20	facts and evidence supporting the terms of the proposed order; and
21	(f) no party has filed written objection stating they do not
22	consent to the entry of the proposed order by submission in the
23	manner described by this section.
24	SECTION 2. (a) This Act takes effect immediately if it

1 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 2 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 3 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 4 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
