A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the dissolution of the Rockwall County Municipal 3 Utility District No. 10. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. (a) The directors of the Rockwall County Municipal Utility District No. 10 shall wind up the affairs of the 6 7 district, including the filing of any dissolution documents with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. 8 9 (b) On the 60th day after the effective date of this Act: (1) the Rockwall County Municipal Utility District 10 11 No. 10 is dissolved; and 12 (2) the terms of the directors of the district expire. 13 SECTION 2. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 14 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 15 16 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished 17 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 18 Government Code. 19 The governor, one of the required recipients, has 20 (b) 21 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. 22 23 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 24 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the

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H.B. No. 5305 1 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 2 representatives within the required time.

3 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 4 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 5 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 6 and accomplished.

7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
