RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud representatives of four major metropolitan 2 LGBTQ chambers of commerce from across the state are gathering in 3 Austin for the first Texas LGBTQ Chambers of Commerce Advocacy Day 4 at the State Capitol on February 14, 2023; and

5 WHEREAS, These organizations include the Austin LGBT Chamber 6 of Commerce, the Greater Houston LGBT Chamber of Commerce, the 7 North Texas LGBT Chamber of Commerce, and the San Antonio LGBT 8 Chamber of Commerce, and they have joined together to form a 9 statewide coalition of more than 1,000 LGBT-owned and allied 10 businesses; the cities the chambers represent account for nearly 11 half of the state's population; and

12 WHEREAS, Having originally joined forces to combat discrimination and promote equality, inclusion, and economic 13 14 vitality across Texas, the chambers are also pursuing a legislative agenda that includes support for economic development and the 15 16 promotion of tourism, for comprehensive nondiscrimination legislation that makes Texas a competitive, business-friendly 17 state, for increased funding for public schools, and for 18 improvements to the state's health care system and its public 19 safety and transportation policies; in addition, the group 20 21 advocates for racial equity in all sectors of the state, including education, employment, health care, and criminal justice; and 22

23 WHEREAS, By bringing their collective voices together in 24 behalf of the LGBTQIA+ business community in the Lone Star State,
