RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Texas State Guard Day is taking place at the State 2 Capitol on April 4, 2023, providing a welcome opportunity to honor 3 the members and leadership of this distinguished branch of the 4 state's military forces; and

5 WHEREAS, The first colonial militia was established in Texas in 1823, when the area was still part of Mexico; after Texans won 6 7 their independence and subsequently became part of the United States, the various militias across Texas were consolidated in 1871 8 9 as the State Guard, which was replaced in 1903 by the Texas Army National Guard; in 1940, the creation of local military units was 10 11 authorized by the U.S. Congress whenever the National Guard was 12 deployed for federal service, and on February 10, 1941, the Texas Legislature created the Texas State Guard, which quickly grew to 13 14 include almost 17,500 officers and enlisted personnel organized into 50 battalions; in 1948, the legislature activated the Texas 15 16 State Guard Reserve Corps, which continued until the Texas State Guard was reauthorized in 1965; and 17

WHEREAS, One of the three branches of the Texas Military 18 Department, the Texas State Guard is headquartered at Camp Mabry in 19 Austin; over the years, the duties of this mission-ready military 20 21 force have included providing security for the state's infrastructure during World War II, maintaining order after civil 22 23 unrest, and conducting recovery efforts after such catastrophic events as the explosion of a freighter in Texas City in 1947 and the 24

loss of the space shuttle Columbia in 2003; since 2005, the guard's 1 deployments have included responding to Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, 2 Ike, and Harvey as well as the COVID-19 pandemic; moreover, the 3 guard has participated in the long-term border missions of 4 5 Operation Border Star and Operation Drawbridge, and it has also taken part in such public service efforts as Operation Lone Star, 6 7 which provides critical medical care to underserved populations in 8 South Texas; and

9 WHEREAS, For more than eight decades, the men and women of the 10 Texas State Guard have lived up to their motto, "Equal to the Task," 11 by standing ready to aid and protect their fellow citizens, and 12 their remarkable record of courageous and dedicated service is 13 truly worthy of celebration; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas 15 Legislature hereby recognize April 4, 2023, as Texas State Guard 16 Day at the State Capitol and extend to all those in attendance 17 sincere best wishes for a memorable and meaningful experience; and, 18 be it further

19 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 20 prepared for the Texas State Guard as an expression of high regard 21 by the Texas House of Representatives.
