RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The residents of Abilene lost an admired champion of 2 higher education and friend to all with the passing of former state 3 representative Dr. Robert D. Hunter on February 11, 2023, at the age of 94; and 4 WHEREAS, The son of Grover Cleveland Hunter and Grace May 5 Grubb Hunter, Bob Hunter was born in Dodge City, Kansas, on June 25, 6 7 1928; he grew up with 11 siblings, and after moving to California, he graduated from high school in San Mateo; he relocated to Texas to 8 Abilene Christian College, beginning a lifelong 9 enroll at affiliation with the institution that would later become Abilene 10 11 Christian University; a leader in campus life during his 12 undergraduate years, he sang in the A Cappella Chorus and Men's Quartet and served as president of several organizations; he was 13 14 also vice president of the Student Association and a statewide officer in the Texas Intercollegiate Student Association; after 15 16 completing his bachelor's degree in business, he served in the U.S. Navy during the Korean War, both in the Far East and with the 17 National Security Agency in Washington, D.C.; and 18 WHEREAS, Dr. Hunter returned to his beloved college alma 19 mater as director of special events, and in 1957, he was named its 20 21 first director of alumni relations; later, as assistant to the president, he directed the 10-year Design for Development that led 22 23 to the construction of many new buildings; he eventually rose to

become senior vice president, a role that encompassed government

- 1 relations, before his retirement in 1993; committed to enriching
- 2 the student and alumni experience, he originated more than two
- 3 dozen ACU traditions, including Freshman Follies, the Parade of
- 4 Flags at Opening Assembly, the President's Circle Dinner, the
- 5 annual alumni awards program, Sing Song, and the Homecoming
- 6 Musical; he was known for his warm smile and trademark greeting,
- 7 "Hello, friend," and his tremendous enthusiasm and congeniality
- 8 helped define the ACU spirit; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In the 1970s, Dr. Hunter also served the wider
- 10 community during a term on the Abilene City Council; from 1970 to
- 11 1980, he was executive vice president of the Independent Colleges
- 12 and Universities of Texas, and he galvanized support for the
- 13 legislation creating the Tuition Equalization Grant program; since
- 14 its establishment, students at private institutions in the state
- 15 have received Tuition Equalization Grants totaling more than
- 16 \$2.6 billion; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Dr. Hunter became the first Taylor County
- 18 Republican to win a seat in the Texas House of Representatives when
- 19 he was elected in 1986, and he was returned to office in the next 10
- 20 elections; working tirelessly in behalf of his constituents and
- 21 higher education in general, he missed just a single roll-call vote
- 22 over the course of two decades, when his doctors refused his pleas
- 23 to release him while he was being evaluated for a possible heart
- 24 attack; for a decade, he chaired the Committee on State, Federal and
- 25 International Relations, and he later led the House Research
- 26 Organization; and
- 27 WHEREAS, In 1990, Representative Hunter championed

H.R. No. 1555 1 legislation to enable Cisco College to build a campus in Abilene; when the bill faced a potential veto from Governor William 2 3 P. Clements, who was displeased with a previous vote by the representative, Dr. Hunter selflessly removed his name from the 4 5 legislation, and the measure became law; the next year, he was appointed chair of the Higher Education Subcommittee on Budget and 6 Oversight, bringing to that role his deep expertise in the state's 7 dual system of higher education; in addition, he was vice chair for 8 the Committee on Regulated Industries and co-chair of the Special 9 House Select Committee on NAFTA and GATT international trade 10 agreements; no matter how stressful the situation, he lived up to 11 his nickname, "Smilin' Bob," and he brightened the days and earned 12 the affection of countless people in the Capitol community; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Dr. Hunter further benefited Abilene as a member of 15 the boards and advisory boards of numerous organizations, among them the Classical Chorus of Abilene, Meals on Wheels, the West 16 17 Texas Rehabilitation Center, the Boys & Girls Clubs, and the Abilene/Taylor County Child Advocacy Center; moreover, he was a 18 19 lifetime member of the VFW and the American Legion and, for over a half century, he was an active member of University Church of 20

21 Christ; and WHEREAS, The recipient of myriad accolades, Dr. Hunter was 22 awarded honorary doctorates by ACU, Texas Wesleyan University, the 23 24 University of St. Thomas, Austin College, Hardin-Simmons University, McMurry University, and Pepperdine University in 25 California; in February 2006, ACU named its Robert D. and Shirley 26 Hunter Welcome Center in honor of Dr. Hunter and his wife; the 27

- 1 couple married on May 27, 1954, and they were blessed with three
- 2 children, Kent, Carole, and Les, as well as numerous grandchildren
- 3 and great-grandchildren; Mrs. Hunter passed away in 2021; and
- WHEREAS, The loss of Bob Hunter is keenly felt by the
- 5 multitude of friends that he made and the many people whose lives he
- 6 forever enriched, but his enormous contributions will continue to
- 7 resonate in the years to come, and he will forever hold a special
- 8 place in the hearts of all who were fortunate enough to know him;
- 9 now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of the Honorable
- 12 Dr. Robert D. Hunter and extend sincere condolences to the members
- 13 of his family: to his children and their spouses, Kent Hunter and
- 14 Jonathan Blumberg, Carole Phillips and her husband, Danny, and Les
- 15 Hunter; to his grandchildren and their spouses, Landon and Jennifer
- 16 Phillips, Chad and Aundrea Phillips, Mitchell and Emily Danesi,
- 17 Dino Hunter, and Lyra Hunter; to his great-grandchildren, Crawford
- 18 Danesi, Henley Danesi, Beckham Phillips, and Kenzo Phillips; and to
