A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to support for nursing-related postsecondary education,
- 3 including scholarships to nursing students, loan repayment
- 4 assistance to nurses and nursing faculty, and grants to nursing
- 5 education programs.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 61.655, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 61.655. PURPOSE; ELIGIBILITY. (a) A scholarship
- 10 program[, matching fund program, or loan repayment program
- 11 established under this subchapter shall be established and
- 12 administered in a manner that the board determines best promotes
- 13 the health care and educational needs of this state.
- 14 (b) The board may establish multiple categories of persons
- 15 to receive scholarships[, matching funds,] and loan repayments.
- 16 The board may include faculty from professional nursing programs
- 17 with master's degrees or doctorates among the categories of persons
- 18 authorized to receive loan repayments.
- 19 (c) Each year funds are available, the board shall establish
- 20 the categories of persons eligible to receive scholarships[$_{m{ au}}$
- 21 matching funds, and loan repayments and the criteria for selecting
- 22 persons to be assisted under each category. The criteria may
- 23 include:
- 24 (1) scholastic ability and performance;

- 1 (2) financial need;
- 2 (3) the geographical area in which the person is
- 3 likely to practice;
- 4 (4) whether the person receives Temporary Assistance
- 5 for Needy Families [Aid to Families with Dependent Children] or
- 6 participates in another public welfare program;
- 7 (5) employment by a state agency;
- 8 (6) employment on a nursing school faculty or a
- 9 person's intention to seek employment on a nursing school faculty;
- 10 (7) whether the person is practicing in a geographical
- 11 area, a practice setting, or an area of practice with an acute
- 12 nursing shortage or is likely to practice in such an area;
- 13 (8) the type of certificate or academic degree held or
- 14 pursued; or
- 15 (9) any additional factors the board considers
- 16 relevant to promoting the health care and educational needs of the
- 17 state.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.656(d), Education Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (d) The board shall distribute information about the
- 21 scholarship program[, matching fund program, and loan repayment
- 22 program established under this subchapter to:
- 23 (1) employers of registered nurses or licensed
- 24 vocational nurses;
- 25 (2) associations of employers;
- 26 (3) schools and educational programs for registered
- 27 nurses or licensed vocational nurses; and

- 1 (4) professional associations of registered nurses or
- 2 licensed vocational nurses.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 61.658(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (b) The board may structure the scholarship program[, the
- 6 matching fund program, and the loan repayment program established
- 7 under this subchapter to secure funds available under federal
- 8 matching programs.
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 61.9822, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 61.9822. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive loan
- 12 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a nurse must:
- 13 (1) apply to the board;
- 14 (2) at the time of application for repayment
- 15 assistance have been employed <u>part-time or</u> full-time for at least
- 16 one year as, and be currently employed part-time or full-time as, a
- 17 faculty member of a nursing degree program at an institution of
- 18 higher education or a private or independent institution of higher
- 19 education; and
- 20 (3) comply with any additional requirements adopted by
- 21 board rule.
- SECTION 5. Sections 61.9823(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) On qualifying for loan repayment assistance under this
- 25 subchapter, a nurse may receive repayment assistance for each year
- 26 of part-time or full-time employment as a faculty member of a
- 27 nursing degree program at an institution of higher education or

- 1 private or independent institution of higher education, not to
- 2 exceed five years.
- 3 (b) The board by rule shall determine the maximum amount of
- 4 loan repayment assistance received by a nurse under this subchapter
- 5 [may not exceed \$7,000] in any one year. The board shall base the
- 6 amount of loan repayment assistance received by a nurse for
- 7 part-time employment on the proportion of the number of hours
- 8 worked by the nurse to the number of hours worked by a full-time
- 9 nurse.
- SECTION 6. Sections 63.202(f) and (g), Education Code, are
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (f) Notwithstanding the limitation provided by Subsection
- 13 (b), grants awarded under Subsection (c) for the state fiscal
- 14 biennium ending on August 31, 2025 [2021], and the fiscal biennium
- 15 ending on August 31, 2027 [2023], by the Texas Higher Education
- 16 Coordinating Board shall be awarded to programs preparing students
- 17 for initial licensure as registered nurses or programs preparing
- 18 qualified faculty members with a master's or doctoral degree for
- 19 the program, including programs at two-year institutions of higher
- 20 education, four-year general academic teaching institutions,
- 21 health science centers, and independent or private institutions of
- 22 higher education, or to the nursing resource section established
- 23 under Section 105.002(b), Health and Safety Code. In awarding
- 24 grants under this subsection, the coordinating board may:
- 25 (1) give priority to institutions proposing to address
- 26 the shortage of registered nurses by promoting innovation in
- 27 education, recruitment, and retention of nursing students and

- 1 qualified faculty;
- 2 (2) award grants on a competitive basis;
- 3 (3) consider the availability of matching funds; and
- 4 (4) fund a study by the nursing resource section to
- 5 evaluate the competencies of clinical judgment and behaviors that
- 6 professional nursing students should possess at the time of
- 7 graduation.
- 8 (g) Subsection (f) and this subsection expire September 1,
- 9 2027 [2023].
- 10 SECTION 7. The following provisions of the Education Code
- 11 are repealed:
- 12 (1) Sections 61.653 and 61.657; and
- 13 (2) Section 61.656(c).
- 14 SECTION 8. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 15 date of this Act, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 16 shall adopt rules necessary to administer the changes in law made by
- 17 this Act.
- 18 (b) The changes in law made by this Act apply beginning with
- 19 loan repayment assistance awarded under Subchapter JJ, Chapter 61,
- 20 Education Code, for the 2024-2025 academic year. Loan repayment
- 21 assistance awarded under Subchapter JJ, Chapter 61, Education Code,
- 22 for an academic year before the 2024-2025 academic year is governed
- 23 by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this
- 24 Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
