- 9 Sec. 81B.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 10 (1) "COVID-19" means the 2019 novel coronavirus
- 11 disease and any variants of the disease.
- 12 (2) "Governmental entity" means this state, a local
- 13 government entity as defined by Section 418.004, Government Code,
- 14 or an agency of this state or a local government entity.
- 15 Sec. 81B.002. PROHIBITED FACE-COVERING MANDATE. A
- 16 governmental entity may not implement, order, or otherwise impose a
- 17 mandate requiring a person to wear a face mask or other face
- 18 covering to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Sec. 81B.003. PROHIBITED VACCINE MANDATE. A governmental
- 20 entity may not implement, order, or otherwise impose a mandate
- 21 requiring a person to be vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Sec. 81B.004. PROHIBITED CLOSURE MANDATE FOR PRIVATE
- 23 BUSINESSES AND SCHOOLS. A governmental entity may not implement,
- 24 order, or otherwise impose a mandate requiring the closure of a

- 1 private business, public school, open-enrollment charter school,
- 2 or private school to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
