- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 32.024(1-1), Human Resources Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (1-1) The commission shall continue to provide medical
- 8 assistance to a woman who is eligible for medical assistance for
- 9 pregnant women for a period of not less than 12 [six] months that
- 10 begins on the last day of the woman's pregnancy and ends on the last
- 11 day of the month in which the 12-month period ends in accordance
- 12 with Section 1902(e)(16), Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section
- 13 1396a(e)(16)) [following the date the woman delivers or experiences
- 14 an involuntary miscarriage].
- 15 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 16 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 17 Services Commission shall seek from the appropriate federal agency
- 18 an amendment to the state's Medicaid state plan to implement
- 19 Section 32.024(1-1), Human Resources Code, as amended by this Act.
- 20 The commission may delay implementing this Act until the state plan
- 21 amendment is approved.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
