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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the procedure for certain complaints against health 1-19 care practitioners. 1-20 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Chapter 112, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subchapter C to read as follows: 1-24

SUBCHAPTER C. COMPLAINT REFERRALS

101. COMPLAINTS AGAINST HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER 1-25 112. LICENSED BY DIFFERENT LICENSING ENTITY. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a licensing entity that receives a complaint concerning a health care practitioner who holds a license issued by a different 1-26 1-27 1-28 1-29 licensing entity shall promptly forward a copy of the complaint to that licensing entity. 1-30

(b) A licensing entity may not take disciplinary action based on a complaint against a health care practitioner who holds a license issued by a different licensing entity unless that 1-31 1-32 1-33 licensing entity refers the complaint back to the licensing entity 1-34 1-35 that received the complaint for investigation and resolution.

1-36 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 1-37 a complaint filed against a health care practitioner on or after the effective date of this Act. A complaint filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 1-38 1-39 complaint was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for 1-40 1-41 that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-42 1-43 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1 - 441-45 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-46 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
