S.B. No. 278

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to exempting textbooks purchased, used, or consumed by
3 university and college students from sales and use taxes for
4 limited periods.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 151, Tax Code, is amended
7 by adding Section 151.3211 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 151.3211. TEXTBOOKS PURCHASED, USED, OR CONSUMED BY
9 UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE STUDENTS FOR LIMITED PERIODS. (a) In this
10 section, "institution of higher education" and "recognized
11 accrediting agency" have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003,
12 Education Code.

13 (b) The sale, use, or consumption of a book written,
14 designed, and produced for educational, instructional, or
15 pedagogical purposes is exempted from the taxes imposed by this
16 chapter if:

17 (1) the book is purchased by a full-time or part-time
18 student enrolled at an institution of higher education or a private
19 or independent college or university that is located in this state
20 and that is accredited by a recognized accrediting agency; and

21 (2) the purchase takes place at or after 12:01 a.m. on
22 the first day, but at or before 11:59 p.m. on the last day, of an
23 exemption period designated by the comptroller under Subsection

24 (c).

1 (c) The comptroller shall designate seven consecutive days
2 in January and seven consecutive days in August of each year during
3 which the exemption authorized by this section is effective. The
4 comptroller shall designate each exemption period for the time in
5 the relevant month when the greatest number of books described by
6 Subsection (b) is likely to be purchased, as determined by the
7 comptroller based on a review of the academic calendars of
8 institutions of higher education and colleges and universities
9 described by Subsection (b)(1). The comptroller shall designate the
10 exemption period in a manner and at a time that provides reasonable
11 notice of the exemption period to retailers and the public.

12 (d) A person may establish that the person is a full-time or
13 part-time student by presenting a valid student identification
14 card. The comptroller by rule shall prescribe the manner by which a
15 person making an online purchase may electronically establish that
16 the person is a full-time or part-time student.

17 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not
18 affect taxes imposed before the effective date of this Act, and the
19 law in effect before the effective date of this Act is continued in
20 effect for purposes of the liability for and collection of those
21 taxes.

22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect July 1, 2023, if it
23 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
24 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
25 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that
26 date, this Act takes effect October 1, 2023.
