- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Sections 161.0035 and 161.0045 to read as
- 7 follows:

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- 8 Sec. 161.0035. VACCINATION ADMINISTRATION REQUIREMENTS.
- 9 (a) A person administering a vaccine to a patient shall:
- 10 (1) before administering the vaccine, provide to the
- 11 patient written information on the vaccine's benefits and risks,
- 12 <u>including any vaccine information statement required by the</u>
- 13 National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act of 1986 (42 U.S.C. Section
- 14 300aa-1 et seq.);
- 15 (2) for each vaccine the person administers, maintain
- 16 a permanent record of the vaccine manufacturer and lot number;
- 17 (3) record each serious health problem, including
- 18 hospitalization, injury, or death, a patient sustains following a
- 19 vaccine the person administers and place that information in the
- 20 patient's record;
- 21 (4) report to the federal Vaccine Adverse Event
- 22 Reporting System any serious health problem, including
- 23 hospitalization, injury, or death, a patient sustains following a
- 24 vaccine the person administers; and

- 1 (5) for each vaccine administered, provide to the
- 2 patient the Vaccine Excipient Summary published by the Centers for
- 3 Disease Control and Prevention.
- 4 (b) Reporting an adverse event associated with the
- 5 administration of a vaccine to the vaccine manufacturer does not
- 6 satisfy the requirements of Subsection (a)(4).
- 7 (c) A person who violates this section and holds a license
- 8 or other certification issued by this state that authorizes the
- 9 person to administer a vaccine is subject to disciplinary action by
- 10 the appropriate licensing or certifying authority as if the person
- 11 violated the applicable licensing or certification law.
- 12 (d) A person may bring a civil action to enjoin a violation
- 13 of this section against a person who violates this section and who
- 14 is not subject to disciplinary action under Subsection (c). A
- 15 claimant who prevails in the action may recover attorney's fees and
- 16 costs associated with bringing the action.
- 17 <u>Sec. 161.0045. IMMUNIZATION HEALTH EXEMPTION PROTECTIONS.</u>
- 18 (a) In this section, "health exemption" means an affidavit or
- 19 certificate a health care practitioner signs stating that, in the
- 20 practitioner's opinion, an immunization poses a significant risk to
- 21 the health and well-being of the practitioner's patient.
- (b) A governmental official, including an official for a
- 23 licensing or certification authority, may not question or sanction
- 24 a health care practitioner for granting a health exemption to the
- 25 practitioner's patient.
- (c) Notwithstanding any other law, a person, including a
- 27 state public health official, child-care facility, school,

- 1 institution of higher education, public or private employer, and
- 2 medical service or long-term care provider, shall:
- 3 <u>(1) accept a health exemption:</u>
- 4 (A) provided by a health care practitioner; and
- 5 (B) filed by an individual on behalf of the
- 6 individual or the individual's minor child for education,
- 7 employment, medical or long-term care, or another activity
- 8 necessary for the individual's quality of life; and
- 9 (2) exempt the individual described by the health
- 10 <u>exemption from an immunization requirement imposed by the person or</u>
- 11 under the laws of this state.
- 12 (d) A person who violates Subsection (c) and holds a license
- 13 or other certification issued by this state is subject to
- 14 disciplinary action by the appropriate licensing or certifying
- 15 <u>authority</u> as if the person violated the applicable licensing or
- 16 <u>certification law.</u>
- 17 (e) A person may bring a civil action to enjoin a violation
- 18 of this section against a person who violates this section and who
- 19 is not subject to disciplinary action under Subsection (d). A
- 20 claimant who prevails in the action may recover attorney's fees and
- 21 costs associated with bringing the action.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
