1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the enforcement of commercial motor vehicle safety
1-20 standards in certain counties.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 644.101(c), Transportation Code, as
1-23 amended by Chapters 74 (H.B. 2749) and 429 (S.B. 901), Acts of the
1-24 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is reenacted and amended
1-25 to read as follows:

1-26 (c) A sheriff or a deputy sheriff of any of the following
1-27 counties is eligible to apply for certification under this section:

1-28 (1) a county bordering the United Mexican States;

1-29 (2) a county with a population of less than 1,000, part
1-30 of which is located within 75 miles of an international border;

1-31 (3) a county with a population of 700,000 or more;

1-32 (4) a county with a population of 400,000 or more that
1-33 borders the county in which the State Capitol is located; ~~or~~

1-34 (5) a county with a population of less than 250,000
1-35 that:

1-36 (A) is adjacent to two counties that each have a
1-37 population of more than 1.2 million; and

1-38 (B) contains two highways that are part of the
1-39 national system of interstate and defense highways;

1-40 (6) ~~(5)~~ a county:

1-41 (A) any part of which is within 30 miles of New
1-42 Mexico; and

1-43 (B) that is adjacent to two or more counties that
1-44 generated \$100 million or more in tax revenue collected under
1-45 Chapters 201 and 202, Tax Code, from oil and gas production during
1-46 the preceding state fiscal year; ~~or~~

1-47 (7) ~~(6)~~ a county with a population of more than
1-48 40,000 and less than 300,000 that is adjacent to a county described
1-49 by Subdivision (4); or

1-50 (8) a county with a population of more than 50,000 and
1-51 less than 90,000 that is adjacent to a county with a population of
1-52 more than 4,000,000.

1-53 SECTION 2. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
1-54 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,
1-55 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
1-56 codes.

1-57 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
