(a) A person may not sell or otherwise transfer a firearm 17 to another person unless: 18 (1) the person is a licensed firearms dealer; or 19 20 (2) the person is not a licensed firearms dealer, and: 21 (A) the person sells or transfers the firearm to a licensed firearms dealer; 22 23 (B) the transferor and the transferee are related within the first degree by consanguinity or affinity as determined 24

1 under Chapter 573, Government Code; or 2 (C) before delivering the firearm to the person 3 to whom the firearm is being sold or transferred, the person selling or transferring the firearm requests that a licensed firearms 4 dealer conduct, in the manner required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922, a 5 national instant criminal background check to verify that the 6 7 person to whom the firearm is being sold or transferred may lawfully 8 possess a firearm. (b) A person who violates this section commits an offense. 9 10 An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor. Sec. 205.052. DUTIES OF LICENSED FIREARMS DEALER. (a) If a 11 12 licensed firearms dealer receives a request to conduct a national instant criminal background check under Section 205.051(a)(2)(C), 13 14 the dealer shall: 15 (1) in the manner required by 18 U.S.C. Section 922, conduct the criminal background check to verify that the person to 16 17 whom the firearm is being sold or transferred may lawfully possess a firearm; and 18 19 (2) notify the person who is selling or transferring the firearm of the results of the criminal background check. 20 21 (b) A licensed firearms dealer who performs a national instant criminal background check under this section may collect a 22 reasonable fee from the person who requests the criminal background 23 24 check. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 25
