## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

6	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 33.026 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 33.026. PARENTAL ACCESS TO LIBRARY CATALOG AND CONSENT
9	FOR STUDENT ACCESS TO CERTAIN LIBRARY MATERIALS. (a) In this
10	section, "library material" means any book, record, file, or other
11	instrument or document listed in a school district's library
12	catalog.
13	(b) A school district shall adopt procedures for:
14	(1) providing parental access to the catalog of
15	available library materials at each school library in the district;
16	<u>and</u>
17	(2) a parent to provide to the district a list of
18	library materials that the parent's student may not be allowed to
19	check out or otherwise access for use outside of the school library.
20	(c) In adopting procedures under Subsection (b), a school
21	district shall allow for a parent to provide a list of library
22	materials, as described by that subsection, through:
23	(1) an electronic or physical form; or
24	(2) use of the school's online library catalog.

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(d) A school district may not allow a student to check out or

- 21 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 4. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 24 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,
- 25 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 26 codes.
- 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
