5	SECTION 1. Section 552.108, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (d), (e), (f), (g), and (h) to read as follows:
7	(d) Notwithstanding other law, a prosecutor may permit a
8	person to view the following evidence of a crime that resulted in
9	the death of a person and that occurred in the prosecutor's
10	jurisdiction:
11	(1) a medical examiner's report, if the person viewing
12	the report is a family member of the person who is the subject of the
13	report and the person who is the subject of the report was a victim
14	of the crime; and
15	(2) video evidence of the crime, if the person viewing
16	the video is a victim of the crime or a family member of a victim of
17	the crime.
18	(e) A person permitted to view a medical examiner's report
19	or video evidence under Subsection (d) may not duplicate, record,
20	capture, or otherwise memorialize the information. A prosecutor
21	may require a person to sign a confidentiality agreement before
22	permitting the person to view the information.
23	(f) A permitted viewing of a medical examiner's report or
24	video evidence under Subsection (d) is not a voluntary disclosure

A governmental 1 body, by providing information under Subsection (d) that is 2 confidential or otherwise excepted from required disclosure under 3 law, does not waive or affect the confidentiality of the 4 5 information for purposes of state or federal law or waive the right to assert exceptions to required disclosure of the information in 6 the future. 7 8 (g) Subsection (d) does not affect: 9 (1) the right of a person to obtain a medical examiner's report or video evidence of a crime from a governmental 10 body under other law; 11 12 (2) the procedures under which the information is obtained under other law; or 13 14 (3) the use that may be made of the information 15 obtained under other law. 16 (h) In this section: 17 (1) "Family member" means a person related to a victim of a crime within the first degree of consanguinity or affinity. 18 (2) "Medical examiner's report" means a report and the 19 contents of such a report created by a medical examiner under 20 Article 49.25, Code of Criminal Procedure, including an autopsy 21 report and toxicology report. The term does not include a 22 photograph or medical image contained in a report. 23 24 (3) "Victim" means an individual who suffered personal injury or death as a result of criminal conduct. 25 26 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a

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crime that occurred before, on, or after the effective date of this

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1 Act.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
