A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to accommodating voters with a disability.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 63.0015, Election Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (d) and adding Subsection (f) to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) An election officer shall [may] accept a person with a
- 8 mobility problem that substantially impairs a person's ability to
- 9 ambulate who is offering to vote before accepting others offering
- 10 to vote at the polling place who arrived before the person.
- 11 (c) Notice of the priority given to persons with a mobility
- 12 problem that substantially impairs a person's ability to ambulate
- 13 shall be posted:
- 14 (1) at [one or more locations in] each entrance to a
- 15 polling place where it can be read by persons waiting to vote;
- 16 (2) on the Internet website of the secretary of state;
- 17 and
- 18 (3) on each Internet website relating to elections
- 19 maintained by a county.
- 20 (d) The notice required by Subsection (c) must read:
- 21 "Pursuant to Section 63.0015, Election Code, an election officer
- 22 shall [may] give voting order priority to individuals with a
- 23 mobility problem that substantially impairs the person's ability to
- 24 move around. A person assisting an individual with a mobility

- 1 problem may also, at the individual's request, be given voting
- 2 order priority. Disabilities and conditions that may qualify you
- 3 for voting order priority include paralysis, lung disease, the use
- 4 of portable oxygen, cardiac deficiency, severe limitation in the
- 5 ability to walk due to arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic
- 6 condition, wheelchair confinement, arthritis, foot disorder, the
- 7 inability to walk 200 feet without stopping to rest, or use of a
- 8 brace, cane, crutch, or other assistive device."
- 9 (f) All procedures and accommodations available for voters
- 10 with disabilities, including voting under Section 64.009, shall be
- 11 posted in an accessible manner on the county clerk's Internet
- 12 website.
- SECTION 2. Section 64.009, Election Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 15 (a-1) At each polling place two parking spaces shall be
- 16 reserved for voting under this section. The spaces may not be
- 17 parking spaces designated specifically for persons with
- 18 disabilities. The parking spaces must be clearly marked with a sign
- 19 as being for use by a voter who is unable to enter the polling place.
- 20 The sign must have a telephone number that a voter may call or text
- 21 to request assistance from election officials at the polling place.
- 22 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 84, Election Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 84.0121 to read as follows:
- Sec. 84.0121. CLERK TO POST APPLICATION FORM ONLINE. (a)
- 25 The early voting clerk shall post the official application form for
- 26 <u>an early voting ballot on the clerk's Internet website in a format</u>
- 27 that allows a person to easily complete the application directly on

- 1 the website before printing.
- 2 (b) The early voting clerk may use the application form
- 3 provided by the secretary of state under Section 84.013 or the early
- 4 voting clerk's own application form.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 84.013, Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 84.013. APPLICATION FORMS FURNISHED BY SECRETARY OF
- 8 STATE. (a) The secretary of state shall maintain a supply of the
- 9 official application forms for ballots to be voted by mail and shall
- 10 furnish the forms in reasonable quantities without charge to
- 11 individuals or organizations requesting them for distribution to
- 12 voters.
- 13 (b) The secretary of state shall provide a printable
- 14 application for a ballot by mail in a format that complies with
- 15 Section 84.0121(a) to the early voting clerk for use under that
- 16 <u>section.</u>
- SECTION 5. Section 104.004(e), Election Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (e) If the voter is physically unable to enter the early
- 20 voting polling place without personal assistance or a likelihood of
- 21 injuring the voter's health, the clerk shall deliver the balloting
- 22 materials to the voter at the polling place entrance or curb
- 23 <u>following the procedures prescribed by Section 64.009</u>.
- 24 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
