A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to investigations and disciplinary action by the Texas
- 3 Medical Board regarding certain treatments or practices during the
- 4 COVID-19 pandemic.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. (a) This Act applies to any person engaged in a
- 7 profession regulated by the Texas Medical Board who was
- 8 investigated or subject to disciplinary action by the board for:
- 9 (1) prescribing or advocating for the use of
- 10 ivermectin, hydroxychloroquine, or budesonide in the prevention or
- 11 treatment of COVID-19;
- 12 (2) making statements regarding the efficacy of masks
- 13 in preventing the transmission of COVID-19; or
- 14 (3) failing to wear or require others to wear masks
- 15 intended to prevent the transmission of COVID-19 in connection with
- 16 the person's practice, other than in areas where it was customary to
- 17 wear masks before the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 18 (b) Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas Medical Board
- 19 shall, for any person described by Subsection (a) of this section:
- 20 (1) vacate any disciplinary action imposed;
- 21 (2) expunge all records of the board related to the
- 22 investigation and disciplinary action;
- 23 (3) refund all fines collected from the person; and
- 24 (4) reimburse the person for all legal fees incurred

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- 1 as a result of the investigation or disciplinary action.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
