A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a rebate of the assessment on the gross receipts of electricity for certain providers of retail electric service. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 16, Utilities Code, is amended by adding Section 16.0015 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 16.0015. REBATE OF ASSESSMENT FOR CERTAIN UTILITIES. 7 (a) In this section, "child-care facility" and "day-care center" 8 9 have the meanings assigned by Section 42.002, Human Resources Code. (b) An electric utility, retail electric provider, or 10 electric cooperative that is subject to Section 16.001 and provides 11 retail electric service to a child-care facility or day-care center 12 at a rate that is reduced by 50 to 100 percent of the regular rate 13 for that service is entitled to a rebate from the comptroller under 14 this section. The electric utility, retail electric provider, or 15 electric cooperative is entitled to an annual or quarterly, as 16 applicable, rebate in an amount that is equal to the amount of the 17 total retail charges, excluding taxes and other fees, that the 18 utility, provider, or cooperative discounted to all child-care 19 facilities and day-care centers receiving service from the utility, 20 provider, or cooperative during the period for which the rebate is 21 requested. The rebate may not exceed the total amount of 22 23 assessments the electric utility, retail electric provider, or electric cooperative owes to the state under this chapter for the 24

- 1 period for which the rebate is requested.
- 2 (c) To receive a rebate under this section, an electric
- 3 utility, retail electric provider, or electric cooperative shall
- 4 submit a list to the comptroller, signed under penalty of perjury,
- 5 of the child-care facilities and day-care centers to which the
- 6 utility, provider, or cooperative provided retail electric service
- 7 <u>at no cost or a reduced rate for the period for which the rebate is</u>
- 8 requested.
- 9 <u>(d) The comptroller may adopt rules as necessary to </u>
- 10 <u>implement this section</u>.
- 11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not
- 12 affect assessments due before the effective date of this Act, and
- 13 the law in effect before the effective date of this Act is continued
- 14 in effect for purposes of the liability for those assessments.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
