## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a peer support network for law enforcement officers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Chapter 105, Education Code, is amended by 4 5 adding Subchapter K, and a heading is added to that subchapter to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER K. CARUTH POLICE INSTITUTE 7 SECTION 2. Sections 1701.621, 1701.622, 1701.624, and 8 9 1701.626, Occupations Code, are transferred to Subchapter K, Chapter 105, Education Code, as added by this Act, redesignated as 10 Sections 105.601, 105.602, 105.603, and 105.604, Education Code, 11 12 respectively, and amended to read as follows: Sec. 105.601 [1701.621]. DEFINITIONS. 13 In this 14 subchapter: 15 (1)"Institute" means the Caruth Police Institute 16 located at the University of North Texas at Dallas. (2) "Law enforcement officer" means a person 17 identified as a peace officer under Article 2.12(1), (2), (3), or 18 (4), Code of Criminal Procedure. 19 (3) [<del>(2)</del>] "Peer" means a person who 20 is а law 21 enforcement officer or retired law enforcement officer. Sec. 105.602 [1701.622]. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. 22 (a) 23 The institute [commission] shall develop a peer support network for law enforcement officers. The network must include: 24

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peer-to-peer support;

2 (2) training for peer service coordinators and peers
3 that includes suicide prevention training;

4 (3) technical assistance for program development,
5 peer service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals,
6 and peers; and

7 (4) identification, retention, and screening of8 licensed mental health professionals.

9 (b) As part of the peer support network for law enforcement 10 officers, the <u>institute</u> [commission] shall ensure law enforcement 11 officers have support in both urban and rural jurisdictions.

12 (c) The <u>institute</u> [commission] shall solicit and ensure 13 that specialized training is provided to persons who are peers and 14 who want to provide peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer 15 services under the network.

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## [(d) The commission may adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter.]

18 Sec. <u>105.603</u> [<del>1701.624</del>]. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PARTICIPANT 19 INFORMATION. Information relating to a law enforcement officer's 20 participation in peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer 21 services under the network is confidential and [<del>may</del>] not <u>subject to</u> 22 <u>disclosure</u> [<del>be disclosed</del>] under Chapter 552, Government Code[<del>, by:</del>

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[(1) the commission;

24 [(2) a law enforcement agency that employs a law
25 enforcement officer participant; or

26 [(3) any other state agency or political subdivision
27 in this state that employs a law enforcement officer participant].

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Sec. <u>105.604</u> [<del>1701.626</del>]. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than
 December 1 of each year, the <u>institute</u> [<del>commission</del>] shall submit a
 report to the governor and the legislature that includes:

4 (1) the number of law enforcement officers who
5 received peer support through the peer support network for law
6 enforcement officers;

7 (2) the number of peers and peer service coordinators8 trained;

9 (3) an evaluation of the services provided under this 10 subchapter; and

11 (4) recommendations for program improvements.

SECTION 3. Section 1701.625, Occupations Code, is transferred to Subchapter K, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, redesignated as Section 1701.5015, Occupations Code, and amended to read as follows:

16 Sec. <u>1701.5015</u> [<del>1701.625</del>]. PROTECTIONS RELATED TO 17 LICENSURE. <u>The commission may not take disciplinary action under</u> 18 <u>Section 1701.501 against an officer based solely on the</u> [<del>A law</del> 19 <u>enforcement</u>] officer's participation in peer-to-peer support and 20 other peer-to-peer services <u>and</u> [<u>under the network</u>] may not 21 <u>consider the officer's participation during</u> [+

22 [(1) serve as the basis for a revocation, suspension, or 23 denial of a license issued under this chapter; or

24 [(2) be considered in] any <u>disciplinary</u> proceeding [related 25 to the officer's licensure] under this chapter.

26 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Occupations Code 27 are repealed:

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(1) Section 1701.623; and

(2) the heading to Subchapter M-1, Chapter 1701.

3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
