## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to creating a temporary educator certification for certain
3	military service members and first responders.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.0444 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.0444. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION FOR CERTAIN MILITARY
8	SERVICE MEMBERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS. (a) In this section, "first
9	responder" means a person elected, employed, or appointed as:
10	(1) a peace officer as defined by Article 2.12, Code of
11	<pre>Criminal Procedure;</pre>
12	(2) fire protection personnel as defined by Section
13	419.021, Government Code; or
14	(3) emergency medical services personnel as defined by
15	Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code.
16	(b) This section applies to a person seeking certification
17	who:
18	(1) has served in the armed forces of the United States
19	and was honorably discharged, retired, or released from active
20	duty; or
21	(2) has served as a first responder and, while in good
22	standing and not because of pending or final disciplinary actions
23	or a documented performance problem, retired, resigned, or

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separated from employment as a first responder.

- 1 (c) The board shall propose rules under this subchapter
- 2 providing for the issuance of a temporary certificate to a person
- 3 described by Subsection (b) who meets all other eligibility
- 4 requirements for certification, except that the person may
- 5 substitute for a requirement that the person hold:
- 6 (1) an associate degree from an accredited institution
- 7 of higher education, 48 months of active duty military service or
- 8 service as a first responder; or
- 9 <u>(2) a bachelor's degree:</u>
- 10 (A) the military service or service as a first
- 11 responder described by Subdivision (1); and
- 12 (B) 60 semester credit hours completed at a
- 13 public or private institution of higher education with a minimum
- 14 grade point average of at least 2.50 on a four-point scale.
- 15 (d) Rules proposed by the board for a temporary certificate
- 16 issued under this section must provide that the certificate is:
- 17 (1) valid for no more than five years;
- 18 (2) limited to a one-time issuance; and
- 19 (3) not subject to renewal.
- 20 (e) A person issued a temporary certificate under this
- 21 <u>section may be issued a standard certificate if the person</u>
- 22 completes all eligibility requirements required for that
- 23 <u>certification</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 21.458, Education Code, is amended by
- 25 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-2) to read as
- 26 follows:
- 27 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), each [Each]

- 1 school district may assign a mentor teacher to each classroom
- 2 teacher who has less than two years of teaching experience in the
- 3 subject or grade level to which the teacher is assigned. A teacher
- 4 assigned as a mentor must:
- 5 (1) to the extent practicable, teach in the same
- 6 school;
- 7 (2) to the extent practicable, teach the same subject
- 8 or grade level, as applicable; and
- 9 (3) meet the qualifications prescribed by
- 10 commissioner rules adopted under Subsection (b).
- 11 <u>(a-2)</u> A school district shall assign a mentor teacher to a

- 15 of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall

- 18 by Section 21.0444, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
