6	SECTION 1. Section 261.101, Family Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (b-2) to read as follows:
8	(b-2) A professional providing prenatal, mental health, or
9	other medical care to a woman who voluntarily discloses to the
10	professional that the woman illegally used a controlled substance,
11	as defined by Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy
12	is not required to make a report under this section if:
13	(1) the woman provides proof that:
14	(A) she is currently enrolled in or has recently
15	<pre>completed a substance abuse treatment program; or</pre>
16	(B) she made reasonable efforts to enroll in a
17	substance abuse treatment program within five days after the date
18	she made a disclosure described by this subsection; or
19	(2) the professional determines:
20	(A) there is no immediate risk of harm to the
21	child from the exposure to the controlled substance; and
22	(B) the woman does not otherwise pose an
23	immediate risk of harm to the child.
24	SECTION 2. Section 261.301, Family Code, is amended by

- (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), with [With] 3 assistance from the appropriate state or local law enforcement 4 agency as provided by this section, the department shall make a 5 prompt and thorough investigation of a report of child abuse or 6 7 neglect allegedly committed by a person responsible for a child's care, custody, or welfare. The investigation shall be conducted 8 9 without regard to any pending suit affecting the parent-child 10 relationship.
- 11 (a-1) The department may not investigate a report of child

  12 abuse or neglect allegedly committed by a woman based on the woman's

  13 illegal use of a controlled substance, as defined by Chapter 481,

  14 Health and Safety Code, during pregnancy if the woman enrolls in and

  15 successfully completes a substance abuse treatment program under
