5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 11.175(c), Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(c) A school district's cybersecurity policy must comply
9	with the cybersecurity controls and requirements adopted by the
10	commissioner under Section 32.351 and may not conflict with the
11	information security standards for institutions of higher
12	education adopted by the Department of Information Resources under
13	Chapters 2054 and 2059, Government Code.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 32, Education Code, is amended by adding
15	Subchapter H to read as follows:
16	SUBCHAPTER H. CYBERSECURITY
17	Sec. 32.351. CYBERSECURITY CONTROLS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a)

 The commissioner shall adopt cybersecurity controls and
 requirements for school districts, open-enrollment charter
 schools, and district and school vendors in consultation with and
 as recommended by the Department of Information Resources.
- (b) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school
 shall implement the cybersecurity controls and requirements
 adopted by the commissioner under this section.

(c) To implement this section, the agency may contract with: 1 2 (1) a regional education service center; 3 (2) a private entity; or 4 (3) a regional network security center under 5 Subchapter E, Chapter 2059, Government Code. 6 The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to (d) 7 implement this section. (e) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year, 8 the commissioner shall review the rules adopted under this section and amend the rules as necessary to ensure that the cybersecurity 10 11 controls and requirements continue to provide effective cybersecurity protection for school districts and open-enrollment 12 13 charter schools. SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is 14 amended by adding Sections 2054.0561 and 2054.0595 to read as 15 16 follows: Sec. 2054.0561. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS. 17 (a) The department may provide technical assistance to school 18 districts and open-enrollment charter schools regarding the 19 implementation of cybersecurity controls, requirements, 20 network operations under Sections 11.175 and 32.351, Education 21 Code. In providing technical assistance to districts and schools, 22 the department may: 23 24 (1) use services offered by third parties; 25 (2) procure technology and services for districts and

- 8 Sec. 2054.0595. CYBERSECURITY RISK ASSESSMENTS FOR PUBLIC
- 9 SCHOOLS. The department may perform a cybersecurity risk
- 10 assessment of a school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 11 at the request of:
- 12 (1) the commissioner of the Texas Education Agency;
- 13 (2) the superintendent of the district or the person
- 14 who serves the function of superintendent of the school, as
- 15 applicable; or
- 16 (3) the Texas Division of Emergency Management after a
- 17 cybersecurity incident affecting the district or school.
- SECTION 4. Section 2059.058(b), Government Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (b) In addition to the department's duty to provide network
- 21 security services to state agencies under this chapter, the
- 22 department by agreement may provide network security to:
- 23 (1) each house of the legislature;
- 24 (2) an agency that is not a state agency, including a
- 25 legislative agency;
- 26 (3) a political subdivision of this state, including a
- 27 county, municipality, or special district;

- 1 (4) an independent organization, as defined by Section
- 2 39.151, Utilities Code; [and]
- 3 (5) a public junior college; and
- 4 (6) an open-enrollment charter school established
- 5 under Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code.
- 6 SECTION 5. Section 2059.201, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 2059.201. ELIGIBLE PARTICIPATING ENTITIES. A state
- 9 agency or an entity listed in Sections 2059.058(b)(3)-(6)
- 10 $\left[\frac{2059.058(b)(3)-(5)}{2059.058(b)(3)-(5)}\right]$ is eligible to participate in cybersecurity
- 11 support and network security provided by a regional network
- 12 security center under this subchapter.
- SECTION 6. Section 11.175(g), Education Code, as added by
- 14 Chapter 1045 (S.B. 1267), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular
- 15 Session, 2021, is repealed.
- SECTION 7. Not later than March 31, 2024, the Texas
- 17 Education Agency and the Department of Information Resources shall
- 18 adopt rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this
- 19 Act.
- 20 SECTION 8. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 21 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,
- 22 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 23 codes.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
