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1 AN ACT relating to the process for notifying the attorney general of a 2 3 breach of security of computerized data by persons doing business 4 in this state. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Sections 521.053(i) and (j), Business & Commerce 7 Code, are amended to read as follows: 8 (i) A person who is required to disclose or provide notification of a breach of system security under this section 9 10 shall notify the attorney general of that breach as soon as practicable and not later than the 30th [60th] day after the date on 11 12 which the person determines that the breach occurred if the breach 13 involves at least 250 residents of this state. The notification under this subsection must be submitted electronically using a form 14 15 accessed through the attorney general's Internet website and must include: 16 17 (1) a detailed description of the nature and circumstances of the breach or the use of sensitive personal 18 information acquired as a result of the breach; 19 (2) the number of residents of this state affected by 20 the breach at the time of notification; 21 22 (3) the number of affected residents that have been 23 sent a disclosure of the breach by mail or other direct method of 24 communication at the time of notification;

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(4) the measures taken by the person regarding the
 2 breach;

3 (5) any measures the person intends to take regarding4 the breach after the notification under this subsection; and

5 (6) information regarding whether law enforcement is6 engaged in investigating the breach.

7 (j) The attorney general shall post on the attorney
8 general's publicly accessible Internet website:

9 <u>(1) an electronic form for submitting a notification</u> 10 <u>under Subsection (i); and</u>

11 (2) a listing of the notifications received by the 12 attorney general under Subsection (i), excluding any sensitive 13 personal information that may have been reported to the attorney 14 general under that subsection, any information that may compromise 15 a data system's security, and any other information reported to the 16 attorney general that is made confidential by law. The attorney 17 general shall:

18 <u>(A)</u> [(1)] update the listing not later than the 19 30th day after the date the attorney general receives notification 20 of a new breach of system security;

21 (B) [(2)] remove a notification from the listing 22 not later than the first anniversary of the date the attorney 23 general added the notification to the listing if the person who 24 provided the notification has not notified the attorney general of 25 any additional breaches under Subsection (i) during that period; 26 and

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(C) [(3)] maintain only the most recently

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1 updated listing on the attorney general's website.

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
