## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the process for notifying the attorney general of a
- 3 breach of security of computerized data by persons doing business
- 4 in this state.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 521.053(i) and (j), Business & Commerce
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (i) A person who is required to disclose or provide
- 9 notification of a breach of system security under this section
- 10 shall notify the attorney general of that breach as soon as
- 11 practicable and not later than the 30th [60th] day after the date on
- 12 which the person determines that the breach occurred if the breach
- 13 involves at least 250 residents of this state. The notification
- 14 under this subsection must be submitted electronically using a form
- 15 accessed through the attorney general's Internet website and must
- 16 include:
- 17 (1) a detailed description of the nature and
- 18 circumstances of the breach or the use of sensitive personal
- 19 information acquired as a result of the breach;
- 20 (2) the number of residents of this state affected by
- 21 the breach at the time of notification;
- 22 (3) the number of affected residents that have been
- 23 sent a disclosure of the breach by mail or other direct method of
- 24 communication at the time of notification;

- 1 (4) the measures taken by the person regarding the
- 2 breach;
- 3 (5) any measures the person intends to take regarding
- 4 the breach after the notification under this subsection; and
- 5 (6) information regarding whether law enforcement is
- 6 engaged in investigating the breach.
- 7 (j) The attorney general shall post on the attorney
- 8 general's publicly accessible Internet website:
- 9 (1) an electronic form for submitting a notification
- 10 under Subsection (i); and
- (2) a listing of the notifications received by the
- 12 attorney general under Subsection (i), excluding any sensitive
- 13 personal information that may have been reported to the attorney
- 14 general under that subsection, any information that may compromise
- 15 a data system's security, and any other information reported to the
- 16 attorney general that is made confidential by law. The attorney
- 17 general shall:
- (A)  $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$  update the listing not later than the
- 19 30th day after the date the attorney general receives notification
- 20 of a new breach of system security;
- 21  $\underline{\text{(B)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(B)}}{\text{(B)}}$ ] remove a notification from the listing
- 22 not later than the first anniversary of the date the attorney
- 23 general added the notification to the listing if the person who
- 24 provided the notification has not notified the attorney general of
- 25 any additional breaches under Subsection (i) during that period;
- 26 and
- (C)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$  maintain only the most recently

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- 1 updated listing on the attorney general's website.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
