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1 AN ACT relating to emergency possession of certain abandoned children by 2 3 designated emergency infant care providers. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 262.301, Family Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (3) and (4) to 7 read as follows: 8 (1)"Designated emergency infant care provider" 9 means: 10 (A) an emergency medical services provider; 11 (B) a hospital; 12 (C) а freestanding emergency medical care 13 facility licensed under Chapter 254, Health and Safety Code; [or] 14 a child-placing agency licensed [by the (D) 15 Department of Family and Protective Services] under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, that: 16 (i) agrees to act as a designated emergency 17 infant care provider under this subchapter; and 18 19 (ii) has on staff a person who is licensed as a registered nurse under Chapter 301, Occupations Code, or who 20 provides emergency medical services under Chapter 773, Health and 21 22 Safety Code, and who will examine and provide emergency medical services to a child taken into possession by the agency under this 23 24 subchapter; or

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1	(E) a fire department.
2	(3) "Fire department" means a department of a local
3	government that is organized to prevent or suppress fires and is
4	staffed 24 hours a day by employees of the local government.
5	(4) "Newborn safety device" means a device installed
6	by a designated emergency infant care provider in compliance with
7	Section 262.3025.
8	SECTION 2. Section 262.302(a), Family Code, is amended to
9	read as follows:
10	(a) A designated emergency infant care provider shall,
11	without a court order, take possession of a child who appears to be
12	60 days old or younger if <u>:</u>
13	(1) the child is voluntarily delivered to the provider
14	by the child's parent <u>by:</u>
15	(A) leaving the child with an employee of the
16	provider; or
17	(B) placing the child in a newborn safety device
18	located inside the provider's facilities; and
19	(2) the parent did not express an intent to return for
20	the child.
21	SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 262, Family Code, is
22	amended by adding Section 262.3025 to read as follows:
23	Sec. 262.3025. NEWBORN SAFETY DEVICE. (a) A designated
24	emergency infant care provider may place a newborn safety device
25	inside the provider's facilities to take possession of a child
26	under Section 262.302.
27	(b) A newborn safety device installed by a designated

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1 emergency infant care provider must: 2 (1) be physically located: 3 (A) inside a facility that is staffed 24 hours a day by employees of the provider; and 4 5 (B) in an area conspicuous and visible to the 6 employees of the provider; and 7 (2) contain an alarm system connected to the device to audibly notify an employee of the provider that a child has been 8 9 placed in the device. (c) A designated emergency infant care provider that places 10 a newborn safety device in the provider's facilities shall develop 11 procedures to regularly verify that the device's alarm system is in 12 13 working order. 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
