A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to continuing judicial training regarding family violence 2 3 victims. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 22.110, Government Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsections (b) and (d) and adding Subsection (d-2) to read as follows: 7 8 The court of criminal appeals shall adopt the rules necessary to accomplish the purposes of this section. The rules 9

10 must: (1) require each district judge, judge of a statutory 11 county court, associate judge appointed under Chapter 54A of this 12 code or Chapter 201, Family Code, master, referee, and magistrate 13 to complete [at least 12 hours of the training] within the judge's 14 first term of office or the judicial officer's first four years of 15 service and provide [a method for] certification of completion of 16 17 at least 12 hours of [that] training that includes:

(A) at[. At] least four hours [of the training must be] dedicated to issues related to trafficking of persons and child abuse and neglect that cover [and must cover] at least two of the topics described in Subsections (d)(8)-(12); and

(B) at [. At] least six hours [of the training 23 must be] dedicated to the training described by Subsections (d)(5), 24 (6), and (7);

- 1 (2) [. The rules must] require each judge and judicial
- 2 officer to complete [an additional five hours of training] during
- 3 each additional term in office or four years of service an
- 4 additional five hours of training that includes:
- 5 (A) at[. At] least two hours [of the additional
- 6 training must be] dedicated to issues related to trafficking of
- 7 persons and child abuse and neglect; and
- 8 (B) at least one hour dedicated to the dynamics
- 9 of and effects on victims of family violence;
- 10 (3) require each judge of a court having primary
- 11 responsibility for or giving preference to family law or family
- 12 violence matters to complete an additional two hours of training
- 13 every two years dedicated to the dynamics of and effects on victims
- 14 of family violence; and
- 15 (4) [. The rules must] exempt from the training
- 16 requirement of this subsection each judge or judicial officer who
- 17 files an affidavit stating that the judge or judicial officer does
- 18 not hear any cases involving family violence, sexual assault,
- 19 trafficking of persons, or child abuse and neglect.
- 20 (d) The instruction must include information about:
- 21 (1) statutory and case law relating to videotaping a
- 22 child's testimony and relating to competency of children to
- 23 testify;
- 24 (2) methods for eliminating the trauma to the child
- 25 caused by the court process;
- 26 (3) case law, statutory law, and procedural rules
- 27 relating to family violence, sexual assault, trafficking of

- 1 persons, and child abuse and neglect;
- 2 (4) methods for providing protection for victims of
- 3 family violence, sexual assault, trafficking of persons, and child
- 4 abuse and neglect;
- 5 (5) available community and state resources for
- 6 counseling and other aid to victims and to offenders;
- 7 (6) gender bias in the judicial process;
- 8 (7) dynamics and effects of being a victim of family
- 9 violence, sexual assault, trafficking of persons, or child abuse
- 10 and neglect;
- 11 (8) dynamics of sexual abuse of children, including
- 12 child abuse accommodation syndrome and grooming;
- 13 (9) impact of substance abuse on an unborn child and on
- 14 a person's ability to care for a child;
- 15 (10) issues of attachment and bonding between children
- 16 and caregivers;
- 17 (11) issues of child development that pertain to
- 18 trafficking of persons and child abuse and neglect; [and]
- 19 (12) medical findings regarding physical abuse,
- 20 sexual abuse, trafficking of persons, and child abuse and neglect;
- 21 and
- 22 (13) dynamics of family violence.
- (d-2) The training described by Subsection (d)(13) must be
- 24 developed in consultation with a statewide family violence advocacy
- 25 <u>organization</u>.
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas
- 27 Court of Criminal Appeals shall adopt the rules necessary to

- 1 provide the training required under Section 22.110, Government
- 2 Code, as amended by this Act.
- 3 (b) Notwithstanding Section 22.110, Government Code, as
- 4 amended by this Act, a judge, master, referee, or magistrate who is
- 5 in office on the effective date of this Act must complete the
- 6 training required by Section 22.110, Government Code, as amended by
- 7 this Act, as applicable, not later than December 1, 2025.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
