17	owner of a firearm shall maintain liability insur	ance coverage in
18	an amount of not less than \$100,000 per occurrence	for injury to or
19	death of one person, and in an amount of not less t	han \$300,000 for
20	injury to or death of two or more people, and in	an amount of not
21	less than \$50,000 for damage to property.	
22	(b) The liability insurance coverage re	equired by this
23	section shall be in effect at all times that the firearm is in the

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1	Sec. 411.703. PROOF OF INSURANCE. (a) Every owner of a
2	firearm shall provide proof of insurance coverage as required by
3	this chapter to any law enforcement officer upon request.
4	(b) Every owner of a firearm in Texas shall provide proof of
5	insurance coverage to the department upon application for a
6	firearms license or renewal of a firearms license.
7	Sec. 411.704. EXCEPTIONS. This subchapter shall not apply
8	to members of the armed forces of the United States or the National
9	Guard, when on duty, or to peace officers.
10	Sec. 411.705. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES. (a) Any person who
11	violates any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a fine of
12	not less than \$100 and not more than \$1,000 for each violation.
13	(b) Any person who knowingly provides false proof of
14	insurance coverage shall be subject to a fine of not less than
15	\$1,000 and not more than \$10,000 for each violation.
16	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
