- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 418.004, Government Code, is amended by 6 adding Subdivision (3-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (3-a) "Illuminated display" means a device capable of
- 8 displaying a flashing light and a continuous light in either the
- 9 color white or the colors blue, green, red, and yellow.
- SECTION 2. Section 418.015(a), Government Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (a) An executive order or proclamation declaring a state of
- 13 disaster:

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- 14 (1) activates the disaster recovery and
- 15 rehabilitation aspects of the state emergency management plan
- 16 applicable to the area subject to the declaration; [and]
- 17 (2) authorizes the deployment and use of any forces to
- 18 which the plan applies and the use or distribution of any supplies,
- 19 equipment, and materials or facilities assembled, stockpiled, or
- 20 arranged to be made available under this chapter or other law
- 21 relating to disasters; and
- 22 (3) activates for the area subject to the declaration
- 23 the disaster identification system described by Section 418.0151.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 418, Government Code, is

1 amended by adding Section 418.0151 to read as follows: 2 Sec. 418.0151. DISASTER IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM. (a) In an area subject to a state of disaster declaration, a person may elect 3 to participate in the disaster identification system activated for 4 5 the area. The system must authorize the use of an illuminated display to communicate with disaster relief personnel. 6 7 (b) A person participating in the disaster identification 8 system shall: 9 (1) affix to each individual and domesticated animal in the person's household an illuminated display of the following 10 colors: 11 12 (A) if the person has a monochromatic illuminated display, the color white for each individual and animal; or 13 14 (B) if the person has a multicolored illuminated 15 display: 16 (i) blue for each individual 18 years of age 17 or older; (ii) green for each individual with a 18 19 disability; 20 (iii) red for each individual younger than 18 years of age; and 21 22 (iv) yellow for each animal; and (2) using the illuminated display, signal to disaster 23 24 relief personnel responding to the area after the disaster with: 25 (A) a continuous light on the display of each 26 household member who does not need medical assistance; or 27 (B) a flashing light on the display of each

- 1 <u>household member who needs medical assistance.</u>
- 2 <u>(c) Disaster relief personnel may patrol the designated</u>
- 3 disaster area by air or ground at night to locate individuals or
- 4 animals with activated illuminated displays.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 418.042(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The division shall prepare and keep current a
- 8 comprehensive state emergency management plan. The plan may
- 9 include:
- 10 (1) provisions for prevention and minimization of
- 11 injury and damage caused by disaster;
- 12 (2) provisions for prompt and effective response to
- 13 disaster;
- 14 (3) provisions for emergency relief;
- 15 (4) provisions for energy emergencies;
- 16 (5) identification of areas particularly vulnerable
- 17 to disasters;
- 18 (6) recommendations for zoning, building
- 19 restrictions, and other land-use controls, safety measures for
- 20 securing mobile homes or other nonpermanent or semipermanent
- 21 structures, and other preventive and preparedness measures
- 22 designed to eliminate or reduce disasters or their impact;
- 23 (7) provisions for assistance to local officials in
- 24 designing local emergency management plans;
- 25 (8) authorization and procedures for the erection or
- 26 other construction of temporary works designed to protect against
- 27 or mitigate danger, damage, or loss from flood, fire, or other

- 1 disaster;
- 2 (9) preparation and distribution to the appropriate
- 3 state and local officials of state catalogs of federal, state, and
- 4 private assistance programs;
- 5 (10) organization of manpower and channels of
- 6 assistance;
- 7 (11) coordination of federal, state, and local
- 8 emergency management activities;
- 9 (12) coordination of the state emergency management
- 10 plan with the emergency management plans of the federal government;
- 11 (13) coordination of federal and state energy
- 12 emergency plans;
- 13 (14) provisions for providing information to local
- 14 officials on activation of the Emergency Alert System established
- 15 under 47 C.F.R. Part 11;
- 16 (15) a database of public facilities that may be used
- 17 under Section 418.017 to shelter individuals during a disaster,
- 18 including air-conditioned facilities for shelter during an extreme
- 19 heat disaster and fortified structures for shelter during a wind
- 20 disaster;
- 21 (16) provisions for quickly replenishing the food
- 22 supplies of area food banks or food pantries following a disaster;
- 23 (17) provisions for protecting public health;
- 24 (18) provisions for the use of the disaster
- 25 identification system described by Section 418.0151; and
- 26 (19) [(18)] other necessary matters relating to
- 27 disasters.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
