1 AN ACT relating to creating a criminal offense for damaging certain 2 3 critical infrastructure facilities and providing for the prosecution of that conduct as manslaughter in certain 4 circumstances; increasing a criminal penalty. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 19.04(b), Penal Code, is amended to read 7 8 as follows: (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the second 9 10 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the defendant committed 11 an offense under Section 28.09 and that conduct caused the death of 12 an individual. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 28, Penal Code, is amended by adding 14 15 Section 28.09 to read as follows: Sec. 28.09. DAMAGING CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY. (a) 16 17 In this section: (1) "Critical infrastructure facility" means an 18 electrical power generating facility, substation, switching 19 station, electrical control center, or electrical transmission or 20 distribution facility. 21 22 (2) "Cyber attack" means an attempt to damage, disrupt, or gain unauthorized access to a computer, computer 23 network, or computer system. 24

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1	(3) "Drone" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.33,
2	Code of Criminal Procedure, as added by Chapter 1011 (H.B. 1758),
3	Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021.
4	(4) "Explosive weapon" has the meaning assigned by
5	Section 28.03.
6	(5) "Extended power outage" means a power outage:
7	(A) lasting for two hours or more; or
8	(B) affecting 1,000 or more meters used to
9	measure electric energy consumption by retail customers.
10	(6) "Firearm" has the meaning assigned by Section
11	46.01.
12	(b) A person commits an offense if, without the effective
13	consent of the owner or operator of a critical infrastructure
14	facility, the person:
15	(1) intentionally or knowingly damages, destroys,
16	vandalizes, or impairs the function of any critical infrastructure
17	facility; and
18	(2) as a result of the conduct described by
19	Subdivision (1), causes an extended power outage.
20	(c) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
21	degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if:
22	(1) the amount of pecuniary damage to the critical
23	infrastructure facility is \$100,000 or more; or
24	(2) the actor uses a firearm, drone, cyber attack, or
25	explosive weapon in the commission of the offense.
26	(d) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
27	section also constitutes an offense under any other law, the actor

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## 1 may be prosecuted under this section, the other law, or both.

2 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 3 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 4 5 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 6 For 7 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 8 9 before that date.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
