M, Pub. L. No. 116-260), or the American Rescue Plan 10 Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2), then supplemental instruction 11 12 provided by a school district under Subsection (a-1)(2) must: (1) include targeted instruction in the essential 13 14 knowledge and skills for the applicable grade levels and subject 15 area; be provided in addition to instruction normally 16 (2) provided to students in the grade level in which the student is 17 enrolled; 18 (3) be provided: 19 20 (A) for <u>10</u> [no less than <u>30</u>] total hours, or more hours if recommended by the school district and authorized by the 21 student's parent or guardian; 22 23 (B) during the subsequent summer or school year; 24 and

1 (C) according to a schedule the district 2 determines is most effective for the student [, unless the 3 instruction is provided fully during summer, include instruction no 4 less than once per week during the school year];

5 (4) be designed to assist the student in achieving 6 satisfactory performance in the applicable grade level and subject 7 area;

8 (5) include effective instructional materials9 designed for supplemental instruction;

10 (6) be provided to a student individually or in a group 11 of no more than <u>six</u> [three] students, unless the parent or guardian 12 of each student in the group authorizes a larger group;

(7) be provided by a person with training in the
applicable instructional materials for the supplemental
instruction and under the oversight of the school district; and

16 (8) to the extent possible, be provided by one person 17 for the entirety of the student's supplemental instruction period.

18 (a-6) The commissioner shall:

19 <u>(1)</u> provide guidelines to school districts on 20 research-based best practices and effective strategies that a 21 district may use in developing an accelerated instruction program;

22 <u>(2)</u> [and shall] provide resources to districts to 23 assist in the provision of an accelerated instruction program; and

24 <u>(3) provide information to districts before the</u> 25 <u>beginning of each semester on effective uses for each resource</u> 26 <u>provided under Subdivision (2)</u>.

If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
