## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to required immunizations for children and primary or
- 3 secondary school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 81.023(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The <u>executive commissioner may recommend to the</u>
- 8 legislature immunizations to include on the list of immunizations
- 9 required [department shall develop immunization requirements] for
- 10 children under Section 161.004.
- 11 (c) The department shall cooperate with the State Board of
- 12 Education in [formulating and] implementing immunization
- 13 requirements for students admitted to public or private primary or
- 14 secondary schools.
- SECTION 2. Section 161.004(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) Every child in the state shall be immunized against
- 18 <u>diphtheria</u>, mumps, poliomyelitis, rubella, rubeola, and tetanus
- 19 [vaccine preventable diseases caused by infectious agents] in
- 20 accordance with the [immunization] schedule prescribed [adopted]
- 21 in department rules. The executive commissioner may not require
- 22 <u>immunizations</u> against any additional diseases for students
- 23 admitted to a public or private primary or secondary school.
- SECTION 3. Sections 38.001(a) and (b-1), Education Code,

- 1 are amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), each [Each]
- 3 student shall be fully immunized against the diseases listed in
- 4 Section 161.004, Health and Safety Code [diphtheria, rubeola,
- 5 rubella, mumps, tetanus, and poliomyelitis, except as provided by
- 6 Subsection (c)].
- 7 (b-1) Each year, the Department of State Health Services
- 8 shall prepare a list of the immunizations required [under this
- 9 section] for admission to public schools [and of any additional
- 10 immunizations the department recommends for school-age children].
- 11 The department shall prepare the list in English and Spanish and
- 12 make the list available in a manner that permits a school district
- 13 to easily post the list on the district's Internet website as
- 14 required by Section 38.019.
- SECTION 4. Section 38.019(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 (a) A school district that maintains an Internet website
- 18 shall post prominently on the website:
- 19 (1) a list, in English and Spanish, of:
- 20 (A) the immunizations required for admission to
- 21 public school in accordance with [by rules of the Department of
- 22 State Health Services adopted under | Section 38.001; and
- 23 (B) [any immunizations or vaccines recommended
- 24 for public school students by the Department of State Health
- 25 Services; and
- [(C)] health clinics in the district that offer
- 27 the influenza vaccine, to the extent those clinics are known to the

- 1 district; and
- 2 (2) a link to the page on the Department of State
- 3 Health Services Internet website that provides [where a person may
- 4 obtain] information relating to the procedures for claiming an
- 5 exemption from the immunization requirements of Section 38.001.
- 6 SECTION 5. Section 42.043(b), Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) The department shall require that each child at an
- 9 appropriate age have a test for tuberculosis and be immunized
- 10 against the diseases listed in Section 161.004, Health and Safety
- 11 Code [diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, mumps, rubella, rubeola,
- 12 invasive pneumococcal disease, and hepatitis A and against any
- 13 other communicable disease as recommended by the Department of
- 14 State Health Services]. The immunization must be effective on the
- 15 date of first entry into the facility. However, a child may be
- 16 provisionally admitted if the required immunizations have begun and
- 17 are completed as rapidly as medically feasible.
- SECTION 6. Section 38.001(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 19 Chapters 43 (H.B. 1098) and 94 (H.B. 1059), Acts of the 80th
- 20 Legislature, Regular Session, 2007, is repealed.
- 21 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter
- 22 38, Education Code, apply starting with the 2023-2024 school year.
- 23 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
