Section 1833e) or under applicable state law; 10

4 SECTION 5. The following provisions of the Occupations Code 5 are repealed:

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(1) Section 1103.205(b); and

(2) Section 1103.259.

SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 8 9 1103.205, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for a 10 certificate or license submitted to the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or after the effective date of this Act. 11 An application submitted before the effective date of this Act is 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was 13 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 14 15 purpose.

16 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act to Section 17 1103.554, Occupations Code, applies only to an offense committed on 18 or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 19 effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is 20 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, 21 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 22 any element of the offense occurred before that date. 23

SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act by the enactment of Section 1104.2051, Occupations Code, apply only to a complaint submitted to the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or after the effective date of this Act. A

1 complaint submitted before the effective date of this Act is 2 governed by the law in effect on the date the complaint was 3 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 4 purpose.

5 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
