S.B. No. 1222

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to regulation of appraisers and the duties of the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 1103.004, Occupations Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 1103.004. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter does not apply to: 8 9 (1) a person who is authorized by law to perform an evaluation of real property for or to provide an evaluation of real 10 property to another person; 11 12 (2) a real estate broker licensed under Chapter 1101 or a sales agent acting under the authority of a sponsoring broker 13 who provides to another person a written analysis, opinion, or 14 conclusion relating to the estimated price of real property if the 15 16 analysis, opinion, or conclusion: 17 (A) is not referred to as an appraisal; 18 is given in the ordinary course of the (B) broker's business; and 19 20 (C) is related to the actual or potential acquisition, disposition, encumbrance, or management of 21 an 22 interest in real property; (3) an appraiser certified by a jurisdiction other 23 24 than this state who performs an appraisal review of an appraisal

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1 performed on real property in this state, if the appraiser does not 2 offer an opinion of value as part of the appraisal review;

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3 (4) an employee of a federally regulated financial institution or any other person engaged by the institution who 4 performs an evaluation of real property for use by the institution 5 in a transaction for which the institution is not required to use 6 the services of a licensed or certified appraiser under federal 7 8 regulations adopted under Title XI, Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of 1989 (12 U.S.C. Section 1833e) or 9 10 under applicable state law;

(5) an employee of a non-bank financial institution or any other person engaged by the institution who provides an analysis, assessment, opinion, conclusion, notation, or compilation of data concerning the value of an interest in real property for use by the institution; [<del>or</del>]

16 (6) the procurement or use of an automated valuation 17 model; or

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(7) a person who:

(A) performs appraisals in connection with the
Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal course as approved
by the Appraiser Qualifications Board; and

22 (B) does not use a title or a reference in 23 violation of Section 1103.201(b).

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(7), the appraisals
described by that subsection may be credited by the board toward
satisfying the education and experience required to obtain a
license or certificate under this chapter.

Section 1103.205(c), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 2 For the purpose of determining the qualifications of an 3 (c) for a certificate or license under this chapter, 4 applicant 5 acceptable appraisal experience includes [+ [(1)] any one or any combination of the categories 6 7 recognized by the Appraiser Qualifications Board[; and 8 [(2) experience as a real estate mortgage lending 9 officer of a financial institution or as a real estate broker that 10 includes the actual performance or technical review of real estate appraisals]. 11 SECTION 3. Section 1103.554(a), Occupations Code, 12 is amended to read as follows: 13 14 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly [+ 15 [(1) provides false information in connection with an 16 affidavit filed under Section 1103.205; or 17 [(2)] violates Section 1103.401. SECTION 4. Subchapter E, Chapter 1104, Occupations Code, is 18 amended by adding Section 1104.2051 to read as follows: 19 Sec. 1104.2051. INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE. (a) 20 The presiding officer of the board, with the advice and consent of the 21 executive committee of the board, may appoint an investigative 22 23 committee. 24 (b) An investigative committee consists of at least two 25 members. The presiding officer of the investigative committee must 26 be a board member. 27 (c) An investigative committee shall:

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<u>(1) review and determine the facts of a complaint; and</u>
<u>(2) submit in a timely manner a written report</u>
<u>regarding the complaint to the board.</u>
SECTION 5. The following provisions of the Occupations Code
are repealed:

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(1) Section 1103.205(b); and

(2) Section 1103.259.

8 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 1103.205, Occupations Code, apply only to an application for a 9 certificate or license submitted to the Texas Appraiser Licensing 10 and Certification Board on or after the effective date of this Act. 11 An application submitted before the effective date of this Act is 12 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was 13 14 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 15 purpose.

16 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act to Section 17 1103.554, Occupations Code, applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed 18 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 19 effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is 20 21 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, 22 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date. 23

SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act by the enactment of Section 1104.2051, Occupations Code, apply only to a complaint submitted to the Texas Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board on or after the effective date of this Act. A

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1 complaint submitted before the effective date of this Act is 2 governed by the law in effect on the date the complaint was 3 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 4 purpose.

5 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
