- 2 relating to the use of certain weapons in or on the bed or bank of a
- 3 navigable river or stream; providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 284.001, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 6 transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 1, Parks and Wildlife Code,
- 7 redesignated as Section 1.014, Parks and Wildlife Code, and amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1.014 [284.001]. USE OF CERTAIN WEAPONS IN OR ON BED OR
- 10 BANK OF NAVIGABLE RIVER OR STREAM [DISCHARGE OF FIREARM]
- 11 PROHIBITED. (a) In this section:
- 12 (1) "Archery equipment" means a longbow, recurved bow,
- 13 compound bow, or crossbow.
- 14 (2) "Firearm" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 15 62.014.
- 16 (3) "Navigable river or stream" has the meaning
- 17 assigned by Section 90.001.
- 18 (b) [This section applies only to a navigable river or
- 19 stream located wholly or partly in Dimmit, Edwards, Frio, Hall,
- 20 Kenedy, Llano, Maverick, Real, Uvalde, or Zavala County.
- [(c)] Except as provided by Subsection (c) [(d)], a person
- 22 may not discharge a firearm or shoot an arrow from any kind of bow
- 23 if:
- 24 (1) the person is located in or on the bed or bank of a

- 1 navigable river or stream at the time the firearm is discharged or
- 2 the arrow is shot from the bow; or
- 3 (2) any portion of the ammunition discharged or arrow
- 4 shot could physically contact the bed or bank of a navigable river
- 5 or stream.
- 6 (c) $\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ This section does not apply to:
- 7 (1) an individual acting in the scope of the
- 8 individual's duties as a peace officer or department employee;
- 9 (2) the discharge of a shotgun loaded with ammunition
- 10 that releases only shot when discharged; [or]
- 11 (3) an individual engaging in fishing using archery
- 12 equipment, if the individual is in compliance with Subsection (e);
- 13 (4) the discharge of a firearm during the legal taking
- 14 of an alligator; or
- 15 (5) the discharge of a firearm from the bank of a
- 16 navigable river or stream to take a venomous snake or nonindigenous
- 17 rodent by:
- 18 (A) an owner of the land adjacent to or through
- 19 which the navigable river or stream runs; or
- (B) an agent of an owner described by Paragraph
- 21 (A) (\pm)
- 22 $\underline{\text{(d)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{)}}$] This section does not limit the ability of a
- 23 license holder to carry a handgun under the authority of Subchapter
- 24 H, Chapter 411, Government Code.
- (e) $[\frac{f}{f}]$ An individual engaging in fishing using archery
- 26 equipment may not possess while fishing:
- 27 (1) an arrow equipped with fletching of any kind;

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- 1 (2) an unbarbed arrow; or
- 2 (3) a bow that is not equipped with a reel and line.
- 3 (f) A person who violates this section commits an offense
- 4 that is a Class C Parks and Wildlife Code misdemeanor.
- 5 (g) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
- 6 section also constitutes an offense under Title 7, the actor may be
- 7 prosecuted under this section or the other law, but not both.
- 8 SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 284, Parks and Wildlife
- 9 Code, is repealed.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
