12	particular need for donors from minority populations;	
13	(2) the partnership between the Glenda Dawson Donate	
14	Life Texas Registry for deceased organ donation, maintained by	
15	Donate Life Texas, and other organ donor registries for living	
16	organ donation;	
17	(3) the requirements for registering as a potential	
18	living organ donor;	
19	(4) the medical screening and procedures necessary for	
20	an individual to be a living organ donor; and	
21	(5) the availability of information about living organ	
22	donation in health care facilities, transplant centers, organ	
23	procurement organizations, tissue banks, eye banks, and driver's	
24	license offices.

- 1 Sec. 54.002. INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS. (a) The department,
- 2 in consultation with Donate Life Texas, shall develop written and
- 3 electronic informational materials, including links to Internet
- 4 websites and machine-readable codes, regarding:

- 6 (2) the process of registering with a living donor
- 7 registry.
- 8 <u>(b) Donate Life Texas may develop and provide the</u>
- 9 informational materials described by Subsection (a) to the
- 10 department.
- 11 (c) The department and the Department of Public Safety shall
- 12 post the information described by Subsection (a) on each of the
- 13 agency's Internet websites.
- 14 (d) Appropriate health care facilities, transplant centers,
- 15 organ procurement organizations, tissue banks, eye banks, and
- 16 <u>driver's license offices may access the informational materials</u>
- 17 <u>described</u> by Subsection (a) on the Internet websites of the
- 18 department and the Department of Public Safety and print the
- 19 materials to place in their facilities or offices to provide to
- 20 residents of this state.
- 21 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 22 of this Act, the Department of State Health Services shall
- 23 establish the program and obtain the informational materials as
- 24 required by Chapter 54, Health and Safety Code, as added by this
- 25 Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
