S.B. No. 1329

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to establishing the Defense and Aerospace Manufacturing 3 Task Force. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 481, Government Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 481.00661 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 481.00661. DEFENSE AND AEROSPACE MANUFACTURING TASK 7 FORCE. (a) In this section, "task force" means the Defense and 8 9 Aerospace Manufacturing Task Force. (b) The Defense and Aerospace Manufacturing Task Force is 10 established within the aerospace and aviation office to study and 11 make recommendations for the promotion of defense and aerospace 12 manufacturing and supply chain security in this state. 13 14 (c) The task force is composed of nine members from the public and private sectors, to be appointed as follows: 15 (1) one representative from the Texas Workforce 16 Commission, appointed by the governor; 17 (2) one representative from the Texas Higher Education 18 Coordinating Board, appointed by the governor; 19 (3) one representative from the Texas Economic 20 Development Council, appointed by the governor; 21 (4) one representative from the Texas Military 22 23 Preparedness Commission, appointed by the governor; 24 (5) one representative from the comptroller's office,

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1	appointed by the governor;
2	(6) one representative from a university receiving
3	federal funds for defense and aerospace manufacturing, appointed by
4	the governor; and
5	(7) three members of the defense and aerospace
6	manufacturing industry, one of whom is appointed by the governor,
7	one of whom is appointed by the lieutenant governor, and one of whom
8	is appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
9	(d) Not later than December 1, 2023, the governor shall
10	convene the first meeting of the task force.
11	(e) The task force may obtain advice, information, and
12	studies from qualified outside experts to perform its duties under
13	this section.
14	(f) Task force members may not receive compensation for
15	services but, subject to the availability of funding, may receive
16	reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred while
17	performing task force business.
18	(g) The task force shall:
19	(1) identify ways to streamline coordination between
20	state and local government regulation and processes;
21	(2) propose a new economic development incentive to
22	attract the manufacturing and supply chain industry;
23	(3) make recommendations to improve the effectiveness
24	of current economic development incentives to attract the
25	manufacturing and supply chain industry;
26	(4) identify ways to bolster supply chains in this
27	state; and

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1	(5) make recommendations to:
2	(A) align the education-to-workforce pipeline in
3	the defense and aerospace industries; and
4	(B) develop and fund apprenticeships in the
5	defense and aerospace industries.
6	(h) Not later than December 1, 2024, the task force shall
7	prepare and submit a written report addressing the issues under
8	Subsection (g) to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the
9	house of representatives, and members of the legislature.
10	(i) This section expires September 1, 2025.
11	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
12	of this Act, the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the
13	house of representatives shall appoint members to the Defense and
14	Aerospace Manufacturing Task Force in accordance with Section
15	481.00661, Government Code, as added by this Act.
16	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
