- 6 METRICS. (a) The board shall develop and implement performance
- 7 goals and performance metrics as part of a comprehensive evaluation
- 8 of the board's review of proposed projects for compliance with
- 9 programmatic and design requirements.
- 10 (b) The board shall periodically:
- 11 (1) collect data regarding the performance metrics;
- 12 (2) analyze the data described by Subdivision (1)
- 13 related to the performance metrics to identify relevant trends; and

- 2 SECTION 9. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter
- 3 17, Water Code, apply only to an application submitted to the Texas
- 4 Water Development Board on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An application submitted to the Texas Water Development Board
- 6 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 7 effect at the time the application was filed, and the former law is
- 8 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
