SECTION 7. Not later than November 1, 2024, the Department of Public Safety shall:

(1) review department's 16 the for processes 17 implementation of and compliance with Section 521.121, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act; and 18

(2) submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, each member of the legislature, and the Texas Judicial Council a written report containing the results of the review, a description of the methods used to prepare the review, and any recommendations for legislative or other action.

25 SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 26 a request for information that is received by a governmental body or 27 an officer on or after the effective date of this Act. A request

1 for information that was received before the effective date of this
2 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the request was
3 received, and the former law is continued in effect for that
4 purpose.

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5 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
