4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. (a) This section takes effect only if the Act of
6	the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, relating to
7	nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted codes
8	becomes law.
9	(b) Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by adding
10	Subchapter K-1 to read as follows:
11	SUBCHAPTER K-1. DYNAMIC MESSAGE SIGNS FOR ALERT SYSTEMS
12	Sec. 411.301. DYNAMIC MESSAGE SIGNS. (a) Except as
13	provided by Subsection (c), the Texas Department of Transportation
14	shall enter into an agreement with a private entity to provide
15	information necessary for statewide alert systems created under
16	Subchapters L, M, P, P-1, and Q as added by Chapter 227 (H.B. 1769),
17	Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, through a
18	system of dynamic message signs that are:
19	(1) located across the state; and
20	(2) capable of displaying digital images useful in
21	locating the missing individual.
22	(b) The agreement under Subsection (a) must generate net
23	revenue to the state, and tax revenue may not be used to fund the
24	installation and operation of the dynamic message signs described

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by Subsection (a). The Texas Department of Transportation may 1 2 accept gifts and grants of money, equipment, or other resources necessary to install and operate the dynamic message signs 3 4 described by Subsection (a). 5 (c) The Texas Department of Transportation is not required to enter into an agreement under Subsection (a) if the department 6 7 receives notice from the United States Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration that the use of the dynamic message 8 9 signs described by that subsection would result in the loss of federal highway funding or other punitive actions taken against 10 11 this state due to noncompliance with federal laws, regulations, or policies. 12 SECTION 2. (a) This section takes effect only if the Act of 13 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, relating to 14 the nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted codes does 15 16 not become law. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the Texas Department of Transportation 21 shall enter into an agreement with a private entity to provide 22 information necessary for statewide alert systems created under 23 Subchapters L, M, P, Q as added by Chapter 220 (H.B. 833), Acts of 24

25 the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, and Q as added by

26 Chapter 227 (H.B. 1769), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular

27 Session, 2019, through a system of dynamic message signs that are:

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1	(1) located across the state; and
2	(2) capable of displaying digital images useful in
3	locating the missing individual.
4	(b) The agreement under Subsection (a) must generate net
5	revenue to the state, and tax revenue may not be used to fund the
6	installation and operation of the dynamic message signs described
7	by Subsection (a). The Texas Department of Transportation may
8	accept gifts and grants of money, equipment, or other resources
9	necessary to install and operate the dynamic message signs
10	described by Subsection (a).
11	(c) The Texas Department of Transportation is not required
12	to enter into an agreement under Subsection (a) if the department
13	receives notice from the United States Department of Transportation
14	Federal Highway Administration that the use of the dynamic message
15	signs described by that subsection would result in the loss of
16	federal highway funding or other punitive actions taken against
17	this state due to noncompliance with federal laws, regulations, or
18	policies.
19	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
