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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the composition, continuation, and duties of the Sexual
3	Assault Survivors' Task Force, compensation for task force members
4	and certain other task force participants, and establishment of a
5	mandatory training program for peace officers on responding to
6	reports of child sexual abuse and adult sexual assault.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
8	SECTION 1. Section 772.0064, Government Code, is amended by
9	amending Subsections (d) and (m) and adding Subsection (n) to read
10	as follows:
11	(d) The task force is composed of the following members:
12	(1) the governor or the governor's designee;
13	(2) a representative of each state agency that has
14	duties relating to the prevention, investigation, or prosecution of
15	sexual assault or other sex offenses or provides services to
16	survivors, including:
17	(A) the office of the attorney general; [and]
18	(B) the Health and Human Services Commission; and
19	(C) the Department of Family and Protective
20	Services;
21	(3) the executive director of the Texas Commission or
22	Law Enforcement or the executive director's designee;
23	(4) the presiding officer of the Texas Forensic

Science Commission or the presiding officer's designee;

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- 1 (5) the division director of the law enforcement
- 2 support division of the Texas Department of Public Safety with
- 3 authority over the Crime Laboratory Service or the division
- 4 director's designee;
- 5 (6) the president of the Texas Association of Crime
- 6 Laboratory Directors or the president's designee;
- 7 (7) the president of the Texas District and County
- 8 Attorney's Association or the president's designee;
- 9 (8) [the president of the Texas Society of
- 10 Pathologists or the president's designee;
- 11 [(9)] the president of the International Association
- 12 of Forensic Nurses Texas Chapter or the president's designee;
- (9) $\left[\frac{10}{10}\right]$ the president of the statewide
- 14 organization described by Section 264.409, Family Code, or the
- 15 president's designee;
- 16 (10) (11) the president of the state sexual assault
- 17 coalition, as defined by Section 420.003, or the president's
- 18 designee;
- (11) $[\frac{(12)}{}]$ a representative from a law enforcement
- 20 agency appointed by the steering committee described by Subsection
- 21 (c);
- 22 (12) [(13)] a sexual assault nurse examiner appointed
- 23 by the steering committee described by Subsection (c) to represent
- 24 the interests of health care facilities that perform sexual assault
- 25 forensic exams;
- 26 (13) an adult survivor of child sexual abuse or the
- 27 parent or guardian of a survivor of child sexual abuse;

- 1 (14) a survivor of adult sexual assault; and
- (15) (14) other members considered appropriate by
- 3 the steering committee described by Subsection (c).
- 4 (m) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the composition or
- 5 duration of the task force or to the designation of the task force's
- 6 presiding officer [This section expires September 1, 2023].
- 7 (n) A task force member who is not employed by a state agency
- 8 or an individual invited by the governor to participate in
- 9 scheduled task force meetings is entitled to:
- 10 (1) a per diem in the amount provided by the General
- 11 Appropriations Act for each day the member performs duties as a task
- 12 force member or the individual attends a task force meeting; and
- 13 (2) reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses
- 14 incurred in performing duties as a member or participant of the task
- 15 force, as applicable.
- SECTION 2. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Subsection (q) to read as follows:
- 18 (q) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 19 commission shall require an officer to complete the basic education
- 20 and training program developed under Section 1701.272. An officer
- 21 shall complete the program not later than the last day of the first
- 22 <u>full continuing education training period after the date the</u>
- 23 officer is licensed under this chapter unless the officer completes
- 24 the program as part of the officer's basic training course.
- 25 SECTION 3. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 26 amended by adding Section 1701.272 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1701.272. TRAINING PROGRAM ON RESPONDING TO SEXUAL

- 1 ABUSE OR ASSAULT. (a) The commission shall, in consultation with
- 2 the Sexual Assault Survivors' Task Force established under Section
- 3 772.0064, Government Code, establish a basic education and training
- 4 program on child sexual abuse and adult sexual assault, including
- 5 the use of best practices and trauma-informed response techniques
- 6 to effectively recognize, investigate, and document those cases.
- 7 The training program must consist of at least eight hours of
- 8 instruction.
- 9 (b) The commission shall require an officer to complete the
- 10 training program unless the officer has completed the training
- 11 under Section 1701.253(q) or other training equivalent to the
- 12 training program as determined by the commission.
- SECTION 4. Section 1701.253(b-2), Occupations Code, is
- 14 repealed.
- 15 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas
- 16 Commission on Law Enforcement shall establish the training program
- 17 required by Section 1701.272, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 18 Act.
- 19 SECTION 6. The minimum curriculum requirements under
- 20 Section 1701.253(q), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, apply
- 21 only to an officer who first begins to satisfy those requirements on
- 22 or after January 1, 2024.
- 23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
