A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the temporary regulation of the practice of veterinary
3	medicine by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 801.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 801.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The State Board of
8	Veterinary Medical Examiners is subject to Chapter 325, Government
9	Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided
10	by that chapter, the board is abolished September 1, 2027 [2029].
11	SECTION 2. Chapter 801, Occupations Code, is amended by
12	adding Subchapter A-1 to read as follows:
13	SUBCHAPTER A-1. TEMPORARY REGULATION BY TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF
14	LICENSING AND REGULATION
15	Sec. 801.021. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
16	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission of
17	Licensing and Regulation.
18	(2) "Department" means the Texas Department of
19	Licensing and Regulation.
20	Sec. 801.022. TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATION OF CHAPTER BY
21	DEPARTMENT; RULES. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, the
22	department shall assume all policy-making powers of the board and
23	administer this chapter. The department may contract as necessary
24	to administer this chapter.

- 1 (b) A power or duty granted to the board under this chapter
- 2 is a power or duty of the executive director of the department, the
- 3 department, or the commission, as applicable.
- 4 (c) The commission or executive director of the department
- 5 may delegate, or withdraw any delegation of, any power or duty under
- 6 this chapter to the board or the executive director of the board.
- 7 The delegation or withdrawal of delegation must be in writing.
- 8 (d) The commission may not adopt a new rule relating to the
- 9 scope of practice of or a health-related standard of care for the
- 10 practice of the profession of veterinary medicine unless the rule
- 11 has been proposed by the board under Section 801.024(c). For a rule
- 12 described by this subsection, the commission shall either adopt the
- 13 rule as proposed or return the rule to the board for revision.
- (e) The commission retains authority for final adoption of
- 15 <u>all rules and is responsible for ensuring compliance with all laws</u>
- 16 <u>regarding the rulemaking process.</u>
- 17 (f) Not later than December 31, 2026, the department shall
- 18 conduct a review under Section 2001.039, Government Code, of each
- 19 rule under 22 T.A.C. Part 24. In conducting the review under this
- 20 subsection, the department shall ensure that license holders and
- 21 the public have a meaningful opportunity to provide input and
- 22 recommend changes to the rules.
- 23 (g) The department shall propose necessary amendments to a
- 24 rule, or the repeal of a rule, for which the department determines
- 25 the board lacks a sufficient reason or authority to adopt or
- 26 enforce.
- Sec. 801.023. SEPARATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS OF

- 1 BOARD. (a) The executive director of the department shall direct
- 2 and may dismiss the executive director of the board. The presiding
- 3 officer of the commission shall appoint a replacement executive
- 4 director of the board if necessary.
- 5 (b) Subject to Subsection (a), the executive director of the
- 6 board is responsible for the administration of financial services,
- 7 human resources, and workforce development duties of the board,
- 8 <u>including:</u>
- 9 (1) accounts payable and accounts receivable;
- 10 (2) budgeting, inventory, and asset management;
- 11 <u>(3) payroll;</u>
- 12 (4) personnel and labor issues;
- 13 (5) purchasing;
- 14 (6) recruitment, evaluation, selection, training, and
- 15 promotion of personnel;
- 16 (7) submitting required reports regarding finances,
- 17 performance measures, strategic planning, legislative
- 18 appropriations requests, operating budgets, and similar
- 19 information as required by law;
- 20 (8) legal support services, including responding to
- 21 requests for public information; and
- 22 (9) information technology and support.
- (c) If the department provides any of the functions listed
- 24 <u>in Subsection (b)</u>, the board shall reimburse the department for
- 25 administrative costs incurred in providing those services.
- Sec. 801.024. ADVISORY BOARD. (a) Notwithstanding
- 27 Subchapter D, the board is an advisory board to the department.

- 1 (b) The board, the equine dental provider advisory
- 2 committee, and any advisory committee appointed under Section
- 3 801.163 shall provide advice and recommendations to the department
- 4 on technical matters relevant to the administration of this
- 5 chapter.
- 6 (c) The board shall propose rules to the commission relating
- 7 to the scope of practice of or a health-related standard of care for
- 8 the practice of the profession of veterinary medicine.
- 9 Sec. 801.025. CONFLICT WITH OTHER LAW. (a)
- 10 Notwithstanding Section 51.003, to the extent of any conflict
- 11 between this chapter and Chapter 51, this chapter controls.
- 12 (b) To the extent of any conflict between this subchapter
- 13 and another provision of this chapter, this subchapter controls.
- Sec. 801.026. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires
- 15 September 1, 2027.
- 16 SECTION 3. (a) In this section:
- 17 (1) "Board" means the State Board of Veterinary
- 18 Medical Examiners.
- 19 (2) "Department" means the Texas Department of
- 20 Licensing and Regulation.
- 21 (b) Not later than October 1, 2023, the Department of
- 22 Information Resources shall consult with the department and the
- 23 board to assess the database needs of the board and establish a plan
- 24 for the procurement and acquisition of a database suitable to
- 25 address those needs.
- 26 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, the board shall provide
- 27 the Department of Information Resources and the department with

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- 1 access to any system, hardware, software, documents, or information
- 2 necessary to achieve the purposes of Subsection (b) of this
- 3 section.
- 4 (d) The provision of information under this section to the
- 5 Department of Information Resources or the department does not
- 6 waive confidentiality or privilege.
- 7 SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2024, the Texas
- 8 Department of Licensing and Regulation shall submit to the Sunset
- 9 Advisory Commission and each standing committee of the legislature
- 10 with primary jurisdiction over the State Board of Veterinary
- 11 Medical Examiners any legislative recommendations necessary to
- 12 improve the board's operations.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
