5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 301, Occupations Code, is

7	Sec. 301.1571. USE OF STANDARDIZED EXAMINATIONS. (a) The
8	board shall adopt rules related to the use by a school of nursing or
9	educational program offered in this state of a standardized
10	examination prepared by a private entity. The rules must prohibit
11	the use of a standardized examination as a graduation requirement
12	or to deny students an affidavit of graduation. The rules may
13	authorize the use of a standardized examination only to:
14	(1) familiarize students with computerized testing;
15	(2) assess potential or enrolled students for purposes
16	<u>of:</u>
17	(A) serving as one component of admissions
18	<u>criteria;</u>
19	(B) evaluating a student's strengths and
20	weaknesses for remediation purposes; or
21	(C) identifying students experiencing academic
22	difficulties who require early remediation; or
23	(3) assess the effectiveness of the school of nursing

1	(A) trend data on student performance;
2	(B) a comparison of student performance with
3	nationwide averages;
4	(C) feedback of student knowledge of program

6	(D) data to monitor the effectiveness of specific
7	course, level, and program curriculum revisions;
8	(E) a measure of student mastery of content; or
9	(F) an evaluation of the effectiveness of
10	curriculum content for revision purposes.
11	(b) The rules adopted under Subsection (a) must provide that
12	a score on a standardized examination may not account for more than
13	10 percent of a course grade for a course in a school of nursing or
14	educational program.
15	(c) A school of nursing or educational program that
16	determines a student is in need of academic remediation on the basis
17	of a standardized examination may not require the student to attend
18	any course offered by the examination provider.
19	(d) Failure to comply with the rules adopted under
20	Subsection (a) may subject the school of nursing or educational
21	program to disciplinary action, including removal of the school's
22	or program's approval status, as determined by the board.
23	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
24	of this Act, the Texas Board of Nursing shall adopt the rules
25	required by Section 301.1571, Occupations Code, as added by this
26	Act.
27	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
