4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 411.02093 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 411.02093. BORDER OPERATIONS TRAINING PROGRAM. (a)
8	The department, in coordination with local law enforcement
9	agencies, shall establish and administer a border operations
10	training program for peace officers employed by local law
11	enforcement agencies that will prepare the officers to:
12	(1) collaborate and cooperate with and assist any law
13	enforcement agency in the interdiction, investigation, and
14	prosecution of criminal activity in the Texas-Mexico border region;
15	and
16	(2) collaborate and cooperate with and assist district
17	attorneys, county attorneys, the border prosecution unit, and other
18	prosecutors in the investigation and prosecution of allegations of
19	criminal activity in the Texas-Mexico border region.
20	(b) The training program under Subsection (a) must include:
21	(1) information on:
22	(A) criminal activity occurring along the
23	Texas-Mexico border, including drug trafficking and trafficking of
24	persons and other activity carried out by cartels, transnational

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1	gangs, and other groups engaged in organized criminal activity; and
2	(B) methods for identifying northbound,
3	southbound, and intrastate criminal activity associated with drug
4	trafficking, trafficking of persons, and other organized criminal
5	activity, including the provision of services to victims of
6	<pre>trafficking;</pre>
7	(2) best practices for investigating and prosecuting
8	the criminal activity described by Subdivision (1) and securing the
9	Texas-Mexico border; and
10	(3) an overview of the department's operations at the
11	Texas-Mexico border, including any collaboration with the United
12	States Customs and Border Protection.
13	(c) The department shall identify opportunities for a peace
14	officer described by Subsection (a) to assist in the department's
15	duties related to border operations. The department may authorize
16	the officer to assist in carrying out those duties.
17	(d) A peace officer authorized by the department to assist
18	in carrying out duties related to the department's border
19	operations as described by Subsection (c) is not entitled to
20	compensation from the department for the assistance provided.
21	(e) The department may partner with federal agencies in
22	administering the training program under Subsection (a) and
23	facilitating any assistance provided by a peace officer under
24	Subsection (c).
25	SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
26	amended by adding Section 1701.359 to read as follows:
27	Sec. 1701.359. BORDER OPERATIONS TRAINING PROGRAM. The

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1	commission may:
2	(1) recognize, or with the consent of the Department
3	of Public Safety administer or assist in administering, the border
4	operations training program established under Section 411.02093,
5	Government Code, as a continuing education program for officers;
6	and
7	(2) credit an officer who successfully completes the
8	program described by Subdivision (1) with the appropriate number of
9	continuing education hours.
10	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
